Re: Oxford Street Martinborough: Footpaths

We understand that local residents have contacted SWDC staff previously regarding the need for a footpath from 100m south of Regent Street to the intersection with Todds Road (about 720m) and the response was that there was no money for such a project. As a consequence the residents at this end of Oxford Street and those of Martinborough Estate have to use the narrow and steeply cambered carriageway to walk to or from the Martinborough village. This is particularly dangerous for any of us with children in a push-chair or who need to use a mobility scooter or similar assistance when using the road. When Martinborough Estate is fully developed there will be a further 40 or so families using this road.

It should also be noted that the road surface is only 5 metres wide whereas the standard is presumably 7 metres (as recently laid in Hinakura Road...further out of town).

So here is a plan that would minimise the expense and allow the Council to start at an early date. Our proposal is:

- 1. Build a footpath on one side only. The south side appears to be the simpler proposition.
- Build the footpath progressively.
 - a. Initially cut and remove the turf.
 - b. Then lay and compact crushed metal, limestone or local pit metal to form a flat and usable temporary surface.
 - c. Build a simple bridge over the creek about half way along at a later stage.(Perhaps a standard concrete slab would be suitable.)
 - d. Finally add a permanent surface (concrete or asphalt) in stages, also at a later date but before the temporary metal surface deteriorates significantly.

If the project was spread over say three years in this way we would hope that it could be funded out of contingencies or other discretionary funds.

Please discuss this letter with your staff. We look forward to learning when work could start.

Draft Annual Plan 2014/15:

Featherston Town Centre consultation process and analysis of submissions – Postpone implementing the Council's preferred option and begin the consultation process again.

I have been extremely disappointed by the process that was undertaken to consult with Featherston residents, and the analysis of submissions is biased.

Featherston residents were sent a shoddily drawn, rough, conceptual layout which did not make it clear that this was the proposal that would be actioned, given sufficient public support. Essentially only one option was provided, and such an approach is bound to skew the results in favour of the proposed option if no other alternatives suggested. The consultation process was therefore fundamentally flawed and consequently the results have low reliability and are at best only an early indication of the direction locals are seeking for this project to take. To take the submission results and commit to landscape or building works on the back of these would be rushed, undemocratic, and biased towards the Council's preferred option.

Because question 1 was poorly worded it is impossible to fairly separate the Town Square proposal from the Menz Shed proposal. It is therefore incredulous to understand how the results the Council postulates can have been properly arrived at. Really it is mere guess work for the Council to now suggest that there has been a clear answer. The answers are unclear because the questions posed were so poorly constructed, and because there was really only one option that could be chosen.

The submission results have shown that 60% of respondents would prefer a position for the relocated Liquor Shop to

be in a location other than Fitzherbert Street. Despite this fact, the Council's analysis of the results is that the preferred position is on Fitzherbert Street. The Council's analysis is therefore demonstrably bias and has chosen to interpret the percentages in a way which suits its own preferred outcome.

60% of locals prefer a location other than Fitzherbert Street for the Menz Shed building despite the consultation process being flawed and only presenting one option. I would suspect that if a number of alternatives had been suggested then there would have been a preference for one of the alternative locations. To relocate a large building on Fitzherbert Street that will only be used occasionally is a barmy idea. It will just add to the the impression that Featherston shopping street is dilapidated and half closed up. I suspect the Council is now trying to rush through the relocation of the Menz Shed to Fitzherbert Street because the Liquor Store is about to be moved and it has run out of time to do a proper consultation with Featherston.

The entire consultation and decision making process appears to have been rushed and there has been a lack of engagement with the community. In contrast the Martinborough Town Hall project seems well funded, well resourced, carefully considered, and has had a number of options presented and properly costed, with heritage effects fully considered. None of these things seem to have occurred with the Featherston town centre scheme, despite the quality and design of the final outcome standing to have a far greater impact on the town itself and also the wider region, given the amount of traffic that passes along Fitzherbert Street. I consequently suggest that Featherston's future has far less importance for the Councillors and officers than Martinborough's Town Hall.

We shouldn't rush into the Council's preferred scheme on the back of shonky consultation, a poor questionnaire, and lack of funding provision. Featherston's future is too important for the region and for Featherstonians, for the Council to commit a huge mistake which can't be corrected. Lets put the Council's current proposal on hold and not make a terrible mistake. Lets start a working group of locals and Council officers with a budget to commission costed plans, to develop three preferred options, and then to consult again with the public to determine the preferred option. The Council should set aside a decent sum of money for the developmental stage, and set aside funds for the build phase within the Annual Plan.

We are residents of the Estate, and have grandchildren who regularly visit. It is becoming increasingly dangerous to walk our grandchildren from the Estate to town because there is no safe off-road place to walk. Walking with a pushchair is very risky because you HAVE to push it on the road. Then when we have the older ones, who we have often, and we want to walk with them while they ride bikes or scooters, it is really extremely dangerous, because the boys, being 4 and 8, are still likely to do unexpected things when near the road. Even the berm is not safe for the children to use, because it is so uneven, they are liable to fall off (perhaps onto the road).

The number of people wanting to use the road to walk to town is increasing with the new houses being built. There is also an increasing number of grandchildren who are visiting the residents of the estate.

My husband and I are VERY concerned about the lack of footpath, and sincerely hope it doesn't take a serious injury involving a child or baby along this road for something to be done regarding the footpath being extended.

We hope that the petition you have (hopefully) received will spur some action on its implementation.

We also request that SWDC review the pool contract to ensure sufficient staffing such that the covers can be used daily and the inflatable slide can be used, at a minimum, every weekend and during school holidays.

Pg 41 Amenities - Martinborough Playground

We received numerous comments from Martinborough residents this year regarding mowing. The playground, in particular, appeared neglected on a number of occasions. We would support a Council review of the mowing contract to prioritise town centre amenities over park areas such as Considine Park.

Pg 41 Amenities - Martinborough Square

Weekend rubbish collection

Martinborough sees significant visitor numbers at weekends from Labour Weekend through to Easter. Locals and visitors alike enjoy our town centre in large numbers on Friday and Saturday evenings. We request that SWDC investigates the possibility of a contracted rubbish collection and 'tidy up' of the Square and playground on Saturday and Sunday mornings.

Provision of a comprehensive infrastructure plan for event organisers

Martinborough's events calendar is continuing to grow, bringing economic benefit to our town. The Square is proving to be a vital part of this events calendar. We have received feedback from event managers that better information could be provided regarding the underground pipes and cables. We request that SWDC consider providing a comprehensive plan of all services, electricity, irrigation etc. to be available for all event organisers wishing to use the Square.

Town centre beautification funds

We support SWDC's continued provision of funds for town centre beautification. In light of the Martinborough Town Hall and Community Centre project we request that the Martinborough town centre beautification funds be carried forward and allocated to Square development when this can be co-ordinated with the town hall precinct landscaping development.

Pg 46 Footpaths – Request for Increased Funding

Martinborough Community Board has identified being "Cycle & Pedestrian friendly" as a priority for Martinborough. We request that SWDC urgently increase funding for repairs, renewals and new footpaths with the intention of speeding up this work.

We support SWDC's stated intention to provide CBD footpaths on both sides of the street and a single footpath in other urban streets. We are receiving increasing feedback from the community expressing concern at the deteriorating state and absence of footpaths around Martinborough. Our footpaths are below standard and our town is not easily accessible for our most vulnerable community members – the elderly, disabled, children and young mothers with prams.

As well as the ongoing repair and renewal work we request that new footpaths around the school are prioritised, in particular Roberts Street (Grey to Weld) and the Dublin/Princess corner.

After this we would suggest the following priorities for new footpaths

- Dublin from Sackville to Regent
- Esther
- Regent from Esther to Dublin

We would also request that a cheaper lime or similar option is investigated for the increasing foot traffic along Oxford Street out to Todds Road.

Pg 46 Road to Cape Palliser

We support SWDC's commitment to this road. It is of vital importance to our coastal communities and visitor industry. We support SWDC's ongoing advocacy efforts to NZTA to secure funding.

Pg 57 Solid Waste Management - Monday collection for Martinborough

Martinborough township has a busy summer events schedule which brings large numbers of weekend visitors to town. Many second homes and homestays are occupied only on weekends and the resulting rubbish and recycling is left on the side of the road until the current Wednesday rubbish collection.

We request that SWDC reviews the rubbish collection day for Martinborough to consider a Monday collection. This will minimise the adverse effects of the wind and roaming animals spreading rubbish and recycling across the town.

This is the first submission I have written to the council. I am writing this out of frustration and dissatisfaction with the gravel road (Te Muna) that both myself and my wife drive on a daily basis going to work and dropping our children at daycare.

The quality of the gravel section of the road is very poor, my wife has had to have her the wheel alignment corrected on her car every 2 months (it should be more often but the cost is prohibitive).

I have been told that the council promised that the road would be sealed to Craggy Range by 2008, this obviously has not happened.

I have recently moved back to Te Muna Rd (Jun 2012) after living on the road in my formative years (1973–1990), the changes in that time have been significant in relation to the amount of people both now living and more importantly working on the road.

With the level of traffic now using Te Muna road, grading only partially fixes the problem for a very limited time. The condition of the road returns to a dire state (mainly potholes) within a day or so.

I read in the annual plan that the council has funding for 2km of new sealed road, I strongly urge you to consider the

section of Te Muna Rd from the existing sealed portion to Craggy Range be selected.

Economic Development

I support the Council's general approach to ensure that the right conditions for economic development in the area. I am opposed to direct involvement by local government by investing in commercial activities such as building shops, factories etc.

For many years rural New Zealand has tried to attract industries to their areas to provide employment for local people. These efforts have rarely been successful and have often cost councils dearly. The usual problem is that the rural area is remote from the market (which means Auckland) and it is cheaper to manufacture close to the market and close to the p[orts where raw materials are imported and finished articles exported. I suggest that rather than trying to attract industries to the Wairarapa we should be trying to attract people. One target group should be people from Wellington who can be offered cheaper housing and a better lifestyle in the Wairarapa. These people work in Wellington but live here and spend here. There children will go to school here and they will help to provide a balance of younger people.

The second group to attract is older people from Auckland or Wellington who are retiring. We are an example of such people. We sold a property in Auckland and that funded a new house in Greytown, providing employment for the local contractors, and we are active in the local community. There must be many people in Auckland who are about to retire, would like to cash up their Auckland property, and have never heard of the Wairarapa. Ultimately, as these

people age, they will need aged care services, and this is one of the growth areas in the NZ economy. It may not provide glamorous high tech employment, but there are creative ways of supporting older folk in their own properties.

Any marketing of the Wairarapa to as a location to move to should be undertaken jointly by the three district councils.

One related initiative that SWDC could undertake would be to approach the big retirement village operators and try to get them to develop a village in Greytown or Martinborough. In Auckland they are building huge villages with 3-400 apartments. But many people don't like apartments and would prefer the village type development with separate houses. This is not possible in Auckland because of land costs. I know this type of development has been tried, but if it is possible to attract one of the major developers they have the marketing power to attract residents from across the whole country. I believe there is such a development in Levin. Why not here?

So I see growth opportunities from attracting older people to the valley, rather than seeing the aging population as a burden.

I am writing on behalf of Hockey Wairarapa to make a submission to Council for this year's Annual Plan Process.

Hockey Wairarapa have recently been in discussion with New Zealand Hockey about the possibility of hosting a Test Series in the Wairarapa later on this year. The series will involve the Black Sticks Women's Team who will play two games at the Trust House Hockey Wairarapa Complex on Saturday 18th and Sunday 19th of October. At this stage the opposition has yet to be confirmed but, the USA team has been invited and it is hoped that they will confirm their attendance very soon. There are details that are still being finalised but any new information will be passed to Council as soon as it is confirmed.

We feel that to host such an event would be a tremendous coup for the region and we would relish the opportunity to bring this level of sport to the Wairarapa. However, in order for this to happen we will require help with funding the event and quite possibly support to provide the infrastructure required at the hockey complex. This would include portable seating (which can be sourced locally) and an electronic scoreboard. Hockey New Zealand also expects that all athletes and officials are accommodated and catered for and that the cost of live streaming of the games is covered.

We hope that the funding required will come from local councils and Trust House Community Trust. We are aware that Hockey Wairarapa may also need to invest in this event if it is to be successful in its attempt to host it.

HW was fortunate enough to secure funding for a water turf which resulted in its official opening in July 2009. The vision behind this was that large tournaments and high caliber games could be played on such a surface. Since then we have successfully held both National and Secondary School Tournaments

and also NHL "warm up" games at Clareville. This has provided both local supporters and visitors the opportunity to see firsthand a fast and exciting sport and also the chance to stay in and tour a part of



RE: SWDC Grant for the artificial turf up-grade at Clareville.

This is a quick update of where the WSAST is at, with the Southern Turf up-grade.

The work schedule is proposed to be undertaken between October 2014 and December 2014, I.E. between the end and start of the winter outdoor hockey seasons.

Installation of the synthetic surface is weather dependent and needs a good number of continuous dry & warm days for installation.

As per the timeline below, we are currently in the process of applying for major grants. One has been lodged with ECCT and another will be lodged with Trust House in the near future.

At this point in time, approximately half of the \$630,000 funding that is required for the project has been secured.

Destination Wairarapa is the Regional Tourism Organisation (RTO) for the region and one of 30 throughout New Zealand. Destination Wairarapa is responsible for the promotion of the Wairarapa to attract more visitors who will stay longer and spend more. Destination Wairarapa is an incorporated society with 280+ member businesses who collectively form the Wairarapa tourism proposition.

Please consider the following in preparing the Council's Annual Plan:

Cycle Trail Development

Wairarapa features heavily in the Nga Haerenga, New Zealand Cycle Trail with:

- Rimutaka Cycle Trail 1 of 22 'Great Rides' in the network
- Wairarapa Valley Cycleway a touring route from Martinborough to Masterton
- Tararua Traverse a touring route from Palmerston North to Alfredton
- Route 52 a touring route from Waipukerau to Masterton

Several communities around New Zealand stand out with the benefits they've received from the growth of cycle tourism. Opotiki and Te Aroha are probably the best examples where businesses associated with the trails are booming.

Closer to home and Featherston is showing signs of growth with six new businesses opening and two relocating since the cycle trail opened. While the new cheese and cane ware shops are not directly related to cycling, they are established on the new energy the town has found. Six tourism operations including tours, shuttles and accommodation have all found their space in Featherston and have had an excellent start in tourism with a strong opening season.

Connecting the Rimutaka Cycle Trail with Featherston via a purpose built off road track would have enormous value for Featherston. This track is more appealing to riders than cycling up the main road and would encourage them to make the 9km ride and then enjoy the services of the town.

Destination Wairarapa supports Council's decision to provide for the development of a trail connecting Featherston with the Rimutaka Cycle Trail in the Annual Plan

Rail Connectivity

The rail connections into and out of the Wairarapa are important for local commuters into Wellington but the rail network also presents excellent opportunities for bringing visitors into the region.



Rail is a strong alternative transport option for special interest groups, conference delegates, event goers and train enthusiasts. The train is a fast, safe alternative to driving and provides excellent views of the transition from urban Wellington into rural Wairarapa after passing through the longest passenger train tunnel in New Zealand.

The rail connections provide opportunities for shuttle and cycle hire companies to connect visitors with the region. A whole weekend experience would be possible but at the moment the service does not exist.

Destination Wairarapa would encourage Council to provide for investment in infrastructure development in Wairarapa or greater Wellington which would help provide a rail service with more rail connectivity.

Featherston - Martinborough - Greytown Bus Connections If the Wairarapa is to encourage visitors to travel via train from Wellington then a local bus service is necessary to meet with trains and connect passengers to Martinborough and Greytown.

Destination Wairarapa would encourage Council to provide in the Annual Plan for subsidising a weekend local bus service which meets all weekend trains and connects passengers with Martinborough and Greytown.

Light Pollution

Wairarapa big skies are a great attraction to visitors and in particular the fast growing Chinese market. Wairarapa big night skies are just as important as the big blue day skies to show off one of the best views of the Milky Way in the world.

Photographer, Mark Gee, has recently presented some excellent examples of night sky imagery which is possible from the Wairarapa. Mark Gee said Wairarapa had a dark sky more than equal to the internationally gold-rated Aoraki Mackenzie Dark Sky Reserve; the first and only such reserve in New Zealand.

Stonehenge Aotearoa receives roughly 5,000 visitors per year. Some of these visitors come specifically to the Wairarapa to see Stonehenge Aotearoa. It's estimated that two thirds of these visitors come from overseas and website analysis indicates their website is accessed from all over the word but particularly from North and South America, Europe, India and Asia with the most from Australia and NZ.

Stonehenge Aotearoa is developing plans to give visitors access to the night sky. They have an astrograph which would be available for taking night sky photos and are planning the construction of a telescope which would provide images usually only seen from the Hubble.

While the Wairarapa night sky is currently in excellent shape, the District Plan really must provide for preserving its condition. The night sky is a visitor attraction but preserving the night environment with appropriate lighting can have additional benefits:

- Reduced cost of lighting through lower wattage bulbs
 - Reduced costs for households
 - o Reduced costs for Council

- Flora and fauna have adapted to niche parts of the daily light cycle such as day, twilight or night.
- Twilight and night are modified or overwhelmed by poor lighting techniques which spill light well beyond the intended area or beyond the timeframe required.

Destination Wairarapa would like to support The Phoenix Astronomical Society's submission to the Annual Plan requesting Council adjusts the District Plan to protect the integrity of the night environment.

Cape Palliser Lighthouse Road

The road to Cape Palliser Lighthouse must be kept open to enable the thousands of visitors access to this world renowned lighthouse and the seal colony.

Lonely Planet travel guide recently listed the Palliser Lighthouse among the Top 10 lighthouses in the world. Travellers purchase the Lonely Planet guide to take on travel advice such as this.

Several tour operators promote travel to the lighthouse and seal colony and these are unique elements of the tour. The tour goes past vineyards and villages but these are not unique propositions in themselves. The lighthouse is a major reason for travel to this southern tip of the north island.

Destination Wairarapa would encourage Council to do whatever is necessary to keep the Palliser Road to Cape Palliser Lighthouse open.

Ngawi Surf Point Toilets

The provision of toilets is vital for locals and visitors particularly in more remote areas.

Destination Wairarapa supports Council's decision to provide for the development of a toilet block at the Ngawi Surf Point in the Annual Plan.

Cycle Festival

Cycling is booming for New Zealand and Wairarapa tourism and generally growing as a viable form of day to day transport. A natural expansion on this is the opportunity to have a cycle festival in the Wairarapa.

Destination Wairarapa is facilitating a collective of cycling operators and community leaders to prepare a festival for the end of summer 2015. This might move in the following year to a pre summer event.

The content of the festival is currently a list of 30 separate activities and events. Run along the same lines as Kokomai with some marquee events supported by a week of other activities, this event would have the potential to draw visitors and provide another event for the community.

It would be expected that the events would be dotted up and down the Wairarapa providing something for each district.

This event would not be owned by Destination Wairarapa and we are simply facilitating the discussion at this stage. Destination Wairarapa would get involved in marketing the festival and expect that our existing budgets could be used to do that.

While the budgets for the festival still need to be prepared, we expect that a professional event manager would need to be taken on and some funds for infrastructure would be required.

On behalf of the collective, Destination Wairarapa would like to ask Council to please consider setting aside \$5,000 for this proposed Cycling Festival in the Annual Plan. Plans and budgets could be presented in June when a final decision could be made by Council.

RE: REGIONAL AMENITIES FUND

Mayor Ron Mark asked Destination Wairarapa to comment on the Regional Amenities Fund. Destination Wairarapa has sent Carterton District Council the following submission and believe it has relevance to your Council as well.

Destination Wairarapa is an incorporated society operating as the Regional Tourism Organisation (RTO) for Wairarapa. Destination Wairarapa has a membership of more than 270 tourism related businesses in the Wairarapa. The core function of Destination Wairarapa is to provide marketing services and product development which underpins the marketing efforts of our members. Destination Wairarapa's strategy states an aim to bring more visitors, who stay longer and spend more.

Destination Wairarapa previously submitted to Council on the Regional Amenities Fund on 7 May 2012. The following points should still be considered by Council before undertaking a commitment to the Regional Amenities Fund:

Wellington is vital for Wairarapa tourism

As an RTO, Destination Wairarapa is keenly aware of the importance of strong amenities for communities and their visitors. A strong, healthy community presents well as a good place for visitors to experience and amenities play a big part in developing and maintaining that strength and health.

Wellington is Wairarapa's gateway for many international visitors who fly in through the airport and cruise in on the Cook Strait ferries. Wellington residents represent Wairarapa's single biggest source of visitors (est. 804,000). The importance of keeping Wellington's community strong and healthy can not be understated from a Wairarapa tourism perspective.

Wellington residents look to the Wairarapa as a major source of recreation and Wellington businesses employ from Wairarapa communities. So for similar reasons, Wellington also needs strong and healthy communities in Wairarapa.

Cost of administering the Regional Amenities Fund

Destination Wairarapa is concerned that the administrative costs for a Chairman, selection panel and funding officer would exhaust the contribution made by Wairarapa Councils.

Wairarapa already contributes to Wellington amenities and economy

1. Destination Wairarapa understands the importance of working closely with Wellington to grow their international visitor market which in turn flows to the Wairarapa.

In the 2012-2013 financial year Destination Wairarapa has invested \$50,000 in international marketing directly through Positively Wellington Tourism. \$20,000 of



this was matched by Tourism New Zealand making Wairarapa's contribution \$70,000.

- 2. Destination Wairarapa has reassigned \$40,000 (with the approval of the Minister) of funding from the Ministry of Economic Development for the development of sustainable tourism in the Wairarapa, to the Rimutaka Cycle Trail which is arguably one of the best Greater Wellington Regional amenities developments for economic benefit to the region.
- 3. Martin Jenkins's 24 February 2012 report on the 'Economic Interdependence between the Western Area of the Wellington Region and Wairarapa' points out that through analysis of credit card spend, the estimated total spend of:
 - i. Western Area of Wellington Region residents in Wairarapa is \$39.7 million per year
 - ii. Wairarapa residents in Western Area of Wellington Region is \$66.4 million per year

New points to consider

- 1. The Wairarapa did receive funding in excess of the \$40,000 contribution made by Masterton District Council.
 - Pukaha Mount Bruce \$50,000
 - Aratoi Museum of Art & History joint marketing support through Te Papa

This result would suggest that with Wairarapa receiving more than its contribution to the fund, another Council received less than their contribution to the fund.

Will the Wairarapa receive less than its contribution to the fund this year?

2. Councils are in a position to negotiate heavily on the amount they contribute to the fund.

Alternatives for Council

Considering the need for Wairarapa to have excellent amenities, the question mark over the cost of administering the fund and Wairarapa's existing contribution to the Wellington amenities and economy, Destination Wairarapa would encourage the Councils to collectively or separately use any budgeted amounts for the Regional Amenities Fund to instead support Wairarapa amenities and events.

Destination Wairarapa would gladly be involved in helping to determine where a similar amenities fund's investment might give the greatest return to the Wairarapa and Wellington.



I would/would not (cross out which does not apply) like to discuss my submission with the Council when it meets to hear and deliberate on formal submissions on 9 and 10 June 2014 (reserve day 10 June 2014), commencing at 9.30am each day.

Submission re Town Hall and adjacent development

Firstly, the Council and local committee must get a big tick for their work with consultant Steve who is obviously a very experienced planner. They have produced a useful proposal to better utilise the existing Hall and to combine with other existing facilities. I prefer another plan, however.

The proposed new centre is a bold vision but how necessary is it? It would seem that retention of the old building is only being justified by adding the new part. The Town Hall has just provided a great venue for Madcaps – the hall size and acoustics would be hard to beat; so why change anything? Is it an earthquake risk? One assumes not, otherwise it should be closed. Little information about strengthening methods is provided but beams seen in the foyer look a solid, if ugly method of strengthening; will this method be continued? Alterations frequently outrun budgets, so is this likely?

My approach would be to leave well alone, and concentrate on a new building with facilities as proposed. This new building would be fronted to the square (with current loos available) and would leave the current playground intact. This new building (or addition to old) shouldn't need an improved town hall to justify more activity. Are there more ideas for town hall use?

The addition concept plan, no doubt a guide only, gives an idea of sizes. I wonder if adequate space is available for the toy library (an excellent idea), merged in with the plunket area. Outside walls appear to be glass, so wall space for displays is limited, with both i-site and library restricted to using space on the internal street walls.

My views will be seen as those of a naysayer, but I firmly believe the proposed plan has too high a risk (in several ways) to justify the rewards.
