### **DECISION**

This is an application by Greytown Rugby Football Club Incorporated for a renewal club licence in respect of premises situated at 123 East Street, Greytown, known as "Greytown Rugby Football Club".

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly, as empowered by Section 134 of the Act, we deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in Sections 105, 106(2) and 131 of the Act and we grant the applicant a renewal club licence authorising the sale and supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises.

### CONDITIONS

# The licence is subject to the following conditions:

(a)Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and hours:

Monday to Thursday

6.00pm to 10.00pm

Friday

5.00pm to 9.00pm

Saturdays and Public Holidays 1.00pm to 12.00 midnight

12.00 noon to 10.00pm

- (b) Drinking water is to be freely available while the premises are open for business
- (c) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.
- (d) The club must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the club is open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of nonalcoholic and low-alcohol refreshments.

- (e) The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
- (f) The Licensee must display:
  - 1) At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.
  - 2) A copy of the licence attached to the inside of the premises so as to be easily read by persons using the premises.
- (g) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed.
- (h) The club must have a secretary at all times.
- (i) Within 10 working days of the appointment of a new secretary, the club must inform the secretary of the appropriate licensing committee the name of the new secretary.
- (j) All proceeds from the sale of alcohol belong to the club.

### CONCLUSION

The application is complete and appears to meet the criteria for a renewal of Club licence. I grant the application made by the Greytown Rugby Football Club for renewal of Club-licence under the provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 authorising the sale and supply of liquor for consumption on the premises known situated at 123 East Street, Greytown and pursuant to the conditions set out above.

### CLUB-LICENCE

Sections 21 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), GREYTOWN RUGBY FOOTBALL CLUB INCORPORATED (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at 123 East Street, Greytown and known as "Greytown Rugby Football Club", for consumption on the premises, to any person who -

- is a member of the club; or
- is on the premises at the invitation of, and is accompanied by, a member of the club; or
- is a member of some other club with which the club has an arrangement for reciprocal visiting rights

The authority conferred by the licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the club in accordance with subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act

### CONDITIONS

ARLA has directed that a replacement licence be issued every time a licence is renewed. The following conditions are consistent with the style of on licence renewal sought:

- (a) The club must have a secretary at all times.
- (b) Within 10 working days of the appointment of a new secretary, the club must inform the secretary of the appropriate licensing committee the name of the new secretary.
- (c) All proceeds from the sale of alcohol belong to the club.
- (d) The club must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the club is open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol refreshments.
- (e) Drinking water is to be freely available while the premises are open for business.
- (f) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and hours:

Monday to Thursday

6.00pm to 10.00pm

Friday

5.00pm to 9.00pm

Saturdays and Public Holidays 1.00pm to 12.00 midnight

Sunday

12.00 noon to 10.00pm

- (g) Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.
- (h) The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
- (i) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed to promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- (i) The Club Committee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed.

The applicant has stated that the club will ensure that substantial food is to be available at all times that alcohol is sold or supplied; and will display the licence, conditions of licence and duty manager as required by the Act.

### CONCLUSION

The application is complete and appears to meet the criteria for a renewal of Club licence. The Inspector recommends that the application made by the Greytown Rugby Football Club Incorporated for renewal of Club-licence be granted under the provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 authorising the sale and supply of liquor for consumption on the premises known as "Greytown Rugby Football Club".

### THE LICENSED PREMISES

The premises, situated at 123 East Street, Greytown are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the Masterton District Licensing Agency on 19th February 2015.

### **DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE**

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The upstairs entrance from the carpark is designated as the principal entrance.

#### DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force-

(a) until its expiry date detailed below; OR

(b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence expires, until the close of the period 3 years after the expiry date.
