

CLUB-LICENCE

Sections 21 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **FEATHERSTON BOWLING CLUB INCORPORATED** (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at 66 Fox Street, Featherston and known as "Featherston Bowling Club", for consumption on the premises, to any person who –

- is a member of the club; or
- is on the premises at the invitation of, and is accompanied by, a member of the club; or
- is a member of some other club with which the club has an arrangement for reciprocal visiting rights for members.

The authority conferred by the licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the club in accordance with subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act

RECOMMENDED LICENCE CONDITIONS

The following conditions are consistent with the style of club licence sought:

1. The Club must have a secretary at all times
2. Within 10 working days of the appointment of a new secretary, the club must inform the secretary of the District Licensing Committee.
3. All proceeds from the sale of alcohol belong to the club.
4. Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and hours:

1 September to 31 May:**Monday to Thursday****10.00am to 10.00pm****Friday to Sunday including public holidays and tournament days****8.00am to 12.00 midnight****1 June to 31 August:****All days****10.00am to 10.00pm**

5. The whole of the premises is undesignated.
6. The club must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the club is open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol refreshments.
7. Drinking water is to be provided to members and their guests free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises
8. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices similar to that shown on the menu submitted with the application must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted
9. The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
10. The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed to promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
11. The Club Committee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The premises, situated at **66 Fox Street, Featherston**, are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the South Wairarapa District Licensing Agency on 5th day of May 2015.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The upstairs entrance from the carpark is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force-

- (a) until its expiry date detailed below; OR
- (b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence expires, until the close of the period 3 years after the expiry date.

DECISION

This is an application by Featherston Bowling Club Incorporated for a club licence in respect of premises situated at 66 Fox Street, Featherston, known as "Featherston Bowling Club Incorporated".

The premises, situated at 66 Fox Street, Featherston are more precisely identified in a plan date stamped as received by the South Wairarapa district licencing Committee on 5th day of May 2015.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. The Police and the Medical Officer of Health also do not oppose the application being granted. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and we grant the applicant a club licence pursuant to s.21.

The licence may issue immediately.

CONDITIONS

The licence is subject to the following conditions::

1. The Club must have a secretary at all times
2. Within 10 working days of the appointment of a new secretary, the club must inform the secretary of the District Licensing Committee.
3. All proceeds from the sale of alcohol belong to the club.
4. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:

1 September to 31 May:

Monday to Thursday

Friday to Sunday including public holidays and tournament days

10.00am to 10.00pm

8.00am to 12.00 midnight

1 June to 31 August:

All days

10.00am to 10.00pm

5. The whole of the premises is undesignated.
6. The club must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the club is open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol refreshments.
7. Drinking water is to be provided to members and their guests free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises
8. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices similar to

that shown on the menu submitted with the application must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted

9. The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
10. The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed to promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
11. The Club Committee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed.

CONCLUSION

Having regard to the relevant provisions of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. I am satisfied that a Club Licence should be granted, pursuant to the conditions set out above.
