Sport Wellington has just had a pretty exciting and busy couple of weeks leading up to the delivery of AMI Round the Bays on 23 February 2014. A record number of 14,000 people from our greater Wellington region community took part in the evnt. With the weather playing its part, it was a great day for all the participants in the 6.5km, 10km and half marathon.

Since our meeting in Lower Hutt on 13 February we have made some progress in line with the agreed view from the meeting. Sue Piper, Grant Baker and I have met to discuss the most effective way Sport Wellington can progress the conclusions arrived at on 13 February. In line with this I will bring together in the very near future the officials group with a view to giving greater definition to the initiative and building a proposition for the elected officials to consider. Once this has been completed then I would envisage this work being tabled to the elected officials representing each TLA and Greater Wellington Regional Council.

I am now in a position to advise that Sport Wellington has received an investment from Sport NZ in this project that will allow us to commit additional resources to the early stages of the project and move things on just a little bit quicker.

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REGION WIDE TLA SPORT AND RECREATION MEETING

What are the biggest challenges facing council in the sport and recreation space?

- Facilities that are appropriate for sports today and funding of those facilities (new, maintaining and upgrading current).
- Public transport infrastructure, access to sport in particular for young families and children is difficult.
- Using the Wairarapa for more regional sports.
- Each town wants their own facilities which means three of everything (3 pools, 3 stadiums etc)
- Funding of those facilities
- Expectations and aspirations of the public (public want facilities to remain in their towns, expectation that facilities will be upgraded and maintained)
- Club coordination, administration of clubs
- Bigger sport and leisure sector administration group to support the sport and recreation sector
- Loss of small town facilities would be a blow
- Needing a region wide approach to keep regional teams in Wellington i.e. Hurricanes and Phoenix
- Funding the on-going cost with current assets without having to increase rates
- Adequately and affectively marketing portfolio of sport and assets
- Ability to responding to new proposals
- Better coordination of funding and leverage opportunities
- Regional alignment of strategy
- Best practice sharing across the region, potential cost savings, potential shared services
- Lack of good facilities and good organisation of those facilities
- Money, money, money
- Coordination, making sure as a region we don't place an unfair expectation on our communities
- False expectation provided by councils
- In favour of a regional approach
- Realisation that facilities might not be in your area but at least it's in the Wellington region and providing these facilities to the people of the greater Wellington Region
- At the Heart Strategy why didn't that work? Investment was an issue of councillors time and money
- Investment around who owns and leads a strategy
- Why have previous strategies fallen over in the past?
- Priority growth agenda may see some challenge around investment into the sport and recreation sector along with others.
- Money grid locked into 8 big projects WCC is looking at.
- Cost and affordability
- Contributing given current council policy
- Social and recreation needs of the community and the impact regionally
- Awareness of what we have, what we provide and keeping it accessible and affordable to all
