APPLICATION FOR FUNDING – NEW ZEALAND CYCLE CLASSIC

Purpose of Report

To present an application for funding from the organisers of the New Zealand Cycle Classic.

Recommendations

Officers recommend that the Council:

- 1. Receive the application for grant funding in relation to the Trust House New Zealand Cycle Classic.
- 2. **Either** approve grant funding including the level of grant, or
- *3. Decline funding.*

1. Executive Summary

Jorge Sandoval contacted me in early July in relation to applying for grant funding for the January 2018 Cycle Classic, to be held 16 to 21 January 2017.

While there had been some discussion prior to this (2016) the applicant missed making an application to our 2017/18 Long Term Plan.

2. Background

An application was made to the <u>2016/17</u> Annual Plan in conjunction with the Huri festival, a grant of \$12,000 was made to that combined group.

This year we funded Huri directly \$5,000, following consideration of their individual submission.

Mr Sandoval indicates in his covering letter he cannot finalise the 2018 race route until this application is considered.

Details of the application are included in Appendix 1.

3. Discussion

Council did not set aside any contingency when allocating grant funding, therefore there is no specific budget available.

The Trust House New Zealand Cycle Classic - 16 / 21 January 2018

Operating for the past 30 years, the New Zealand Cycle Classic (NZCC) has grown from a domestic road cycle race to become a mainstay on the Union Cycliste International (UCI) global calendar.

We have a great event, full of potential to grow and to do this, we need your support to continue to:

- provide riders with high grade events for them to mature and grow within the sport
- give New Zealand race officials the opportunity to learn and broaden the pool of capable officials needed for an expanding race calendar
 - \circ $\;$ this level of racing is so much faster and more complex than local racing
 - engagement of officials and volunteers helps them grow in capability with the higher demands of this level of racing
 - more types of officials are required such as support vehicles, judges, time keepers, traffic management; all at a level significantly higher than they'd be used to in their normal club environments
 - the unique opportunity to work with UCI officials to learn what they need at this level of racing
- provide young and up and coming New Zealand cyclists with the opportunity to take part in an international event in their own country
- be part on an international event and train volunteers.

With your support we will achieve this.

The Event

- The only UCI endorsed race in New Zealand making it the premier road cycling event in the country
- The only road cycle event in New Zealand with full support of NZ Police
- International competitors enjoy not having to move to a new hotel at the end of each stage of the race; five days racing in a hub and spoke type format from a single accommodation
- Wairarapa has extraordinary terrain for a varied five stage event and providing an equally varied visual spectacle for spectators and media

The success of this international event in the past, has been due to the support provided by organizations like NZCT and we are very grateful for your continuous support.

Wairarapa NZCC 2018

- The event will generate a sense of pride that an event with participants of the highest calibre will be in the region as part of an international calendar.
- This will inspire the community to come out and watch the tour and ideally become involved in the sport of cycling in greater numbers as riders and/or officials.

• Local participation will be huge with the community and fun events planned around the event. World class BMX demonstrations do not come to the



Wairarapa without events like the NZ Cycle Classic to underpin them.

Major community events conducted during the NZ Cycle Classic were:

- Castlepoint Station Family Fun Ride torrential rain kept numbers low (60)on this event but previous events have seen 200+ vehicles arrive for a similar event
- Pedal for Parkinsons held midweek as a fundraiser for Parkinsons, organisers counted 80 participants
- Kids Holiday Programme included:
 - BMX demonstration 400+ Martinborough
 - Children's on course races 20+
- The community will dress up and get track side to support teams and riders in greater numbers than in the past.

While it's difficult to report on the numbers in the community who participate track side, we do know that the numbers have grown year on year. This series of photos shows the different ways the community engaged and we are certain that the continued growth will continue into 2018.



- The televised coverage of the race can tell the community stories more effectively and will showcase the region to an international audience
- Print media and local news media are interested in this calibre of event and will need the community stories for colour under the race itself.
- A central race village will provide opportunities for the community to have closer than ever engagement with riders and teams.
- Riders and teams will be found throughout the community at their favourite coffee stops and provide another opportunity to engage with the teams and riders
- The community pride, better understanding of the sport and contact with the teams will inspire more people to get involved in the sport and gain the social, physical and mental benefits
- Huri Huri; Wairarapa's Bike Festival will have more leverage for community engagement with events with this level of competition
- Huri Huri operates under a programme to enable kids from less financially able families to get involved in the sport; this event will provide added motivation.
- This event will require significant numbers of volunteers who will benefit from the returns volunteering gives.
- The event will deliver significant economic benefit to the region.

Cycling Community

- The event will encourage up and coming competitive cyclists with first hand engagement with this level of cycling
- Race officials and drivers will be upskilled under the guidance of UCI officials
- The upskilled race officials and drivers will flow on to improve other cycle events in the community and nationwide.

Basis of Preparation

Measurement Base
