5.1 The Backspace at Thrive

The application met the criteria and partial funding was allocated.

5.2 Aaron Cross

The Committee noted that the capital items couldn't be funded and that there was a low participation level. The project was declined due to these concerns.

5.3 Greytown Music Group

The application met the criteria and funding was granted.

5.4 Martinborough Events Trust

The project met Creative Communities Scheme criteria however the application required development.

Partial funding was granted on the condition that the Trust resubmits the project costs section of the application.

5.5 Christopher Cruz

The application was declined as it did not meet the Creative Communities Scheme criteria.

5.6 Friends of Stella and Sarah

The project met Creative Communities Scheme criteria however the application required development and was declined. The Committee asked for written indications of support identifying potential funding amounts from funders to reduce the risk of the project not going ahead.

5.7 The Lord Lackbeards Touring Company

The Committee noted that the production would continue with or without funding as it was scheduled for the 14 March 2015 and that the productions were outside the South Wairarapa. The project was declined as it was considered a lower priority for funding.

6 General Business

Resignations had been received from Kate McWiggin and Janine Adams. Penny Griffin will be resigning from the Committee at the end of the financial year. The Committee thanked Kate, Janine and Penny for their input to the CCS Committee and to Penny for her many years as chair.

The Committee agreed to give Chris Miller a three month project extension to enable the project to be completed.
