Officer Recommendations

1. That the above appointments will replace the appointments of Mayor Beijen, Cr Leigh Hay and Cr Rebecca Fox (primary appointment) to the Wairarapa Combined District Plan Joint Group made on the 20 November 2019.

1. Background

The report relating to recommendation P&R2020/08, including the draft terms of reference for the proposed joint committee, are included in the agenda for the Planning and Regulatory Committee meeting held 1 July 2020. These recommendations (excluding SWDC appointments) will also be considered by Masterton and South Wairarapa District Councils. If one council proposes changes to any of the recommendations, the recommendations will need to be reconsidered by all three councils.

Members of the Planning and Regulatory Committee noted the importance of ensuring that the quorum requirements of the new Joint Committee included at least one member from each district.

1.1 Previous Appointments

On the 20 November 2019 Mayor Beijen used his s41A of the Local Government Act 2002 (LGA) powers to appoint himself, Cr Hay and Cr Fox to a 'yet to be officially formed' Wairarapa Combined District Plan joint body. These appointments were endorsed by Council.

A terms of reference for the Joint Committee has now been prepared and entering a formal arrangement between the councils is the recommended course of action.

Council should note that if the membership recommendations from the Planning and Regulatory Committee are endorsed, to avoid doubt, Council should also resolve to replace the previous appointments.

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
