## REPORT FROM HER WORSHIP THE MAYOR

## **Purpose of Report**

To update Council on activities and issues which have arisen since my last report to Council.

## Recommendations

Her Worship the Mayor recommends that Council:

1. Receives the information.

## 1. Long Term Plan

Council received 182 submissions to the LTP and 56 individuals or organisations made oral submissions to council. This was a very pleasing response to the LTP and shows that the South Wairarapa is concerned in the future of the district.

There were a wide range of topics raised by submitters and positive feedback and responses for the projects raised in the Consultation document.

The final LTP will be adopted at this meeting.

On behalf of Council I would like to thank all the members of the public who participated in the development and discussion of the LTP, the council officers who have worked tirelessly over many months to prepare the document and budgets, organise the submission process, comment on submissions and finalise the final plan. I would especially like to thank Jennie, Kyra and Suzanne. We really do appreciate all the work that you have done over the last 10 or 11 months. I would also like to thank Councillors, Community Board members, Amiria and Reuben representing the Maori Standing Committee for your input into the development of the LTP. It has been a very good collaborative process.

## 2. Featherston Ward Vacancy

The result of the by-election will be known on 10th July.

## 3. Featherston Land

The Featherston Community Board held a public meeting facilitated by Jenny Rowan on 19<sup>th</sup> May in the ANZAC Hall. A number of issues were raised by members of the public. Questions regarding the Fitzherbert Street land were answered.

Council has appointed Chris Hodson QC to review the Featherston land information, documentation and Council and Community Board resolutions. The officer's report and the review will be presented to this meeting. A council workshop was held on June 6<sup>th</sup>.

Council has met and been in very positive discussions with Chorus to reach a workable solution to the ducting easement that will allow the land to be developed and built on in the future.

## 4. LGNZ Conference and Remits

The Conference will be held in Christchurch between 15 and 17 July. Councillor Jephson, Olds, Mr Crimp and myself will be attending.

I propose Council will workshop the remits and decide on voting preference. The remits were not received in time to have them as an agenda item for this meeting.

## 5. Governance Review

The Governance Review facilitated by EQUIP has commenced, this will be completed in July.

## 6. GWRC

GWRC proposed changes to the Revenue and Financing Policy regarding Floodplain Management. SWDC opposed the changes to the Revenue and Financing Policy, Mr Crimp and I gave a verbal submission to the hearings committee. After strong opposition especially from the Wairarapa GWRC have withdrawn the proposal.

Whaitua Committee– the Ruamahunga Whaitua committee have released the WIP for discussion. This has been 4 years in the making and I want to acknowledge the work our SWDC Council representative Cr Colin Olds has done over this time. Colin has kept us informed of the progress of the WIP and has put in hundreds of hours as a committee member.

Thank you Colin for the work you have done on behalf of the South Wairarapa.

### 8. Events

The last 6 weeks have seen many community projects come to or nearing the completion of their project, these include; The Featherston Sculpture Trust Paul Dibble sculpture, Martinborough Plastic Bag Free campaign, DIY Marae at Hau Ariki Marae Martinborough and the Queen's Birthday Right Royal Knees Up campaign to attract visitors to Greytown, the Featherston RSA Battle of Messines Commemoration, the Kiwi Ball and Wairarapa Sports Awards.

Visiting the Paul Dibble Studio to view the Featherston Sculpture Trust Sculpture was a highlight for this period. The Trust have now raised all the funds needed which is a real credit to the Trust. The sculpture is amazing and will become an international and national attraction once it is in place in November. I want to congratulate the Sculpture Trust for the idea, the determination to get the project to installation and for your fundraising skills. Nearly \$700,000.00 is a very impressive figure to raise.

The bus stop needs to be moved further down Fitzherbert St (papers are in today's agenda). Council has set aside \$45,000 for the foundations and instillation which will be started in August.

Another highlight for this period was the launch of Martinborough Plastic Bag Free campaign at the Martinborough Business Association AGM. 10,000 reusable bags have been produced and are available at most Martinborough businesses. This was a great community driven project that has been taken up by nearly all Martinborough retailers and businesses. Congratulations to the organisers and businesses for initiating this campaign. Single Use Plastic bags, plastic will not be available in shops from 1 July. Plastic drinking straws and single use coffee cups are also being phased out in some café's.

Hau Ariki Marae is looking stunning with new landscaping, replaced rotten boards, painting, a new deck and an impressive carved entranceway. The Martinborough community really stepped up over 3 days to transform the Marae, not only did people pick up hammers, spades or paintbrushes but made and prepared food to feed over 100 people each day. The Marae Committee did a wonderful job organising various tradesmen and sponsors from the local community and further afield.

I attended the Featherston Rugby club 140<sup>th</sup> anniversary dinner, judged "Dancing with the Stars" at the Kiwi Ball which was a fundraiser for Pukaha

and attended the Wairarapa Sports Awards. I also attended the launch of the "Wairarapa Food Story".

## UPDATE ON RURAL BROADBAND INITIATIVE PHASE TWO/MOBILE BLACK SPOTS FUND PROGRAMME ROLL OUT

Dear Mayor Napier and Mr Crimp,

I am writing to update you on the coverage and deployment schedule information that was released on 28 May for the Rural Broadband Initiative Phase Two/Mobile Black Spot Fund (RBI2/MBSF) programme. This letter updates you on the coverage in your District and on where interested parties can find information about whether their household or business will be covered, and if so when.

In this release Hon Clare Curran, Minister for Broadcasting, Communications and Digital Media, announced an accelerated timetable for the rollout of the RBI2/MBSF programme to help close the digital divides in New Zealand. The RBI2/MBSF programme was due for completion by the end of 2022, however the new schedule aims to have it substantially finished by the end of 2021 – a year earlier than previously planned.

### **Background**

As you are most likely aware, Crown Infrastructure Partners (CIP) is partnering with the Rural Connectivity Group<sup>1</sup> (RCG) to provide RBI2 and MBSF coverage in your District. Alongside this, CIP is partnering with WizWireless, a regional wireless internet service provider (WISP) who has in-depth knowledge of providing coverage in your District.

A key responsibility of our implementation partners is securing access to land and sites for the wireless/mobile infrastructure and gaining Council consent for the deployment of this infrastructure, and will now be liaising with you directly. This is important to ensure that the programme moves in a timely and cost-effective manner.

### Rural Broadband Initiative Phase Two/Mobile Black Spot Fund

The South Wairarapa District is in line to receive new coverage under the RBI2/MBSF programme, which will greatly benefit those in the District by providing improved broadband connectivity.

The RBI2 programme will provide enhanced broadband for approximately 711 households, farms and businesses (being 96% of the households and businesses identified in your District that were in scope for the RBI2 programme, i.e. those without access to at least 20 Mbps download speeds).

Your District will also receive new mobile coverage under the MBSF at one tourism area. The MBSF build schedule is set out in the attached document.

In total there will be five new mobile towers built in your District.

Details of indicative new coverage coming to your District can be found in the attached map. These maps are also available on the CIP website (<a href="www.crowninfrastructure.govt.nz">www.crowninfrastructure.govt.nz</a>). Please note that the map only shows additional coverage coming under the programme and *not* existing mobile or broadband coverage.

The initial deployment plan would result in the following build profile over the coming years for the RBI2 programme in your District:




Table 1: Cumulative RBI2 build profile for South Wairarapa District

There is an address look-up facility now live at the <u>National Broadband Map</u>, where individual households/farms/businesses can look up their addresses and will be advised whether they will receive coverage, and if so, the indicative timing for this. The map can be found at <u>www.broadbandmap.nz</u>.

The above schedule may change based on access to land, power and backhaul. As this firms up over time, and as actual sites are made live, the National Broadband Map will be updated showing planned and actual coverage.

### Second round of contracting

We also note that there will be a second contracting round targeting the end users in your District that were not contracted in the first round. This process is underway now and we will advise you of the results towards the end of 2018.

We have previously communicated to you that once initial RBI2/MBSF contracts had been signed, we would come back to you and to discuss co-funding and assistance for additional areas in your District to receive any coverage that was not included in the initial deployment plans. This is not necessary at this time, because we are now actively looking to expand the programme through a second contracting round, utilising Government funding.

Once the second contracting round has been completed, you may still want to consider co-funding for any areas that do not receive additional RBI2 or MBSF coverage but which you believe would benefit from coverage. If that is the case we are happy to liaise with you on these.

We are very pleased with the progress our partners are making in rolling out the RBI2/MBSF programme. With your assistance, we will be sure to make a real difference to the digital connectivity of your community and of rural and regional New Zealand as a whole.


