1. Christchurch Attacks

New Zealand has been shocked and angered by the unprecedented attacks on innocent people praying in the mosques in Christchurch.

SWDC has conveyed our sincere condolences and support to the victims, their families, the Muslim community and the people of Christchurch.

South Wairarapa joined with many other districts around New Zealand and organised vigils to honour and mourn those who died and were injured in the Christchurch Attacks. A vigil was held in Masterton with a number of South Wairarapa people attending.

I would like to thank Ann Randle, Dudley-Anne Hill and Robyn Ramsden and Jen Bhati for organising the vigils in the respective towns. Our communities appreciated the opportunity to come together and support those who died or were injured and support each other at this very sad time. It was also a chance to recognise and thank the emergency services who played such a huge role in helping the victims and acknowledge the Muslim community in Christchurch and the Wairarapa. The message at all of the services was of peace, love and the end to racial hatred.

2. SWDC Civic Awards

The SWDC Civic Awards were held on 1 April. There was a large number of nominations from across the district and the dedication and commitment shown by the individuals or groups was inspiring and overwhelming. South Wairarapa

has a wonderful caring culture, people are prepared to give their time to help others and improve our communities in many ways. We are fortunate to have so many people who are willing to help and support our communities.
