Key issues from meeting	Karl Nesbitt reported that graffiti strikes are down but vandalism is escalating and he is seeing a pattern. Featherston has had serious vandalism in May occurring mostly in the Town Centre.  Martinborough is experiencing graffiti mostly Kitchener, Strassbourgh and Cologne Street area.  Hope reported witnessing a b & e at the new Supermarket site Featherston while on Community Patrol and seeing headstones at the cemetery vandalised.  Sue Tennent noted that cameras would be a good solution and that Carterton DC have spent \$50,000 on cctv cameras and signage and have been successful in getting prosecutions. Graffiti/vandalism is low.  Helen is currently working on a Camera report for Council but in the meantime members agreed that she look at immediate interim measures and speak with business people in Featherston as well.  No Police Report was available.
Speakers	Helen McNaught presented a draft Graffiti Prevention and Management Policy for discussion.  Neighbourhood Support – Sue Tennent spoke about the form the meeting at Circus on Sunday 18 May would take and Robyn Ramsden the Featherston NS Coordinator reported on the success of the programme in her area.
