REPORT FROM HIS WORSHIP THE MAYOR

Purpose of Report

To update Council on activities and issues which have arisen since my last report to Council.

Recommendations

HIs Worship the Mayor recommends that Council:

- 1. Receives the Report from His Worship the Mayor.
- 2. Provide feedback on whether Council should support the Upper Hutt City Council initiative 'seeking a moratorium on current and future consents for the extraction of water from groundwater systems for the purposes of retail and wholesale where the end product is bottled water', and write to the government.
- 3. Provide feedback on whether Council should make LGOIMA requester names public along with the area of concern.
- 4. Approves in principle the draft submission prepared by the Wellington Water Committee on the Taumata Arowai Bill and delegates to the Mayor and CEO to approve the final document for submission to the Health Committee.

1. Bottled Water Consent Moratorium

As per inward correspondence from His Worship Mayor Guppy, it has been requested we write to Minister Parker to declare a moratorium on consents as per the letter in Appendix 1.

There is currently one consent in existence for the South Wairarapa to bottle water, as yet unused.

Whilst I agree in principal, and feel the specific Council should have input into any consents issued, I would pass this onto Council to discuss any letter content and final decision.

2. Transparency Implementation

I feel the following measures have given the public cause to be confident decisions are being made openly:

- Removal of non-public Official Working Groups from the committee structure
- Reduction in the number of committees
- Appointment of an Independent member of the Finance, Audit and Risk Ctte
- Streaming of meetings (awaiting equipment install)

Implementation of public drop in meetings in three main centres (31 performed to date)In the further interests of openness, it has been suggested a table be prepared for every public information request to Council and their area of concern, grouped by applicant. I would appreciate Council opinion on this additional measure.

3. Taumata Arowai Bill

Council are asked to review the draft submission (to be tabled) to the Taumata Arowai Bill prepared by the Wellington Water Committee and approve the draft in principle.

The Bill will implement the Government's decision to create a new regulatory authority to oversee, administer and enforce the drinking water regulatory system. The Bill is part of a broader package of reforms to New Zealand's three waters regulatory system, following the Government's cross-agency Three Waters Review.

The Bill is expected to be enacted around August 2020, making Taumata Arowai (the new Crown Entity regulator) a legal entity at that time.

The submission has been prepared on behalf of the governance body of the six member councils of the Council Controlled Organisation Wellington Water.

REQUEST TO GOVERNMENT TO PLACE MORATORIUM ON BOTTLED WATER CONSENTS

Dear Mayor Beijen,

Commercial water bottling continues to be a contentious topic in communities throughout New Zealand, as frequently reported in the media. Given this activity is not specifically regulated under the Resource Management Act, the Upper Hutt City Council, on behalf of its community, has written to the Government to request an immediate moratorium on any current and future consents for the extraction of water from groundwater systems for the purposes of retail and wholesale where the end product is bottled water.

BOTTLING OF WATER FOR RETAIL AND WHOLESALE PURPOSES

Dear Minister,

The Upper Hutt community is greatly concerned that the Greater Wellington Regional Council granted a consent to Heretaunga Water Ltd on a non-notified basis to take and use groundwater at a rate of 179,712 m3 per second, at a maximum of 576 m3 per day and at a maximum pump rate of 10 litres per second, for bottling and retail purposes. The key concern of our community is the potential impacts of such a take on the aquifer and possibly downstream.

It is our view that the consent contravenes sec 10(1) (b) of the Local Government Act 2002 - the purpose of Local Government is to promote the social, economic, environmental, and cultural well-beings of communities and in the present and for the future; in that the potential impacts of such volume of water for bottling purposes will be detrimental to the four well beings of our community.

The Upper Hutt City Council, on behalf of our community requests an immediate moratorium on any current and future consents for the extraction of water from groundwater systems for the purposes of retail and wholesale where the end product is bottled water.
