REPORT TO COUNCIL ON 2019 LGNZ CONFERENCE

This year's conference was held in Wellington from Sunday 7th of July and finishing midafternoon on Tuesday the 9th of July.

There were 628 delegates attending from various Government and non-Government agencies.

The Annual General Meeting was held on the Sunday afternoon. Mayor Napier and I were appointed voting delegates. Taking the wishes from our Council, we voted accordingly. There were twenty-one remits heard and supported by their submitters. Voting was electronic, you either supported, not supported or abstained. Every delegate had to vote one way or the other as "not voting" at all was picked up during this electronic process.

The morning sessions were focused on Localism with commentary from various speakers.

The first afternoon session continued to focus on Localism. This was followed by an address from our Local Government Minister Hon Manaia Mahuta.

The focus then shifted to Housing and building in New Zealand.

The conference dinner was held in the evening and provided further opportunity to network and socialise.

Day three started around 9am. The first session being Managing Fresh water – best practice. There was some robust discussion with the consensus being "we can do better"
