### SUBMISSIONS ON THE CONSULTATION DOCUMENT ANNUAL PLAN 2019/20 PROPOSALS REPORT

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#### **Purpose of Report**

To present the 2019/20 Annual Plan Submissions and summary of submissions for consideration.

#### **Recommendations**

Officers recommend that the Council:

1. *Receive the Submissions on the Annual Plan Consultation Document 2019/20 Proposals Report.*
2. *Consider the submissions and make resolutions and changes to the 2019/20 Annual Plan as necessary.*

## **1. Executive Summary**

The proposed Annual Plan for the 2019/20 financial year was released for public consultation on 10 April 2019. A total of 174 submissions have been received (see previously circulated detail on Stellar), resulting in approximately 286 individual requests for comments.

The submissions have been summarised and are presented as Appendix 2. Officers have reviewed the submissions and made comments against individual requests. It should be noted that not all respondents answered every question in the consultation document, hence the disparity between submission numbers under each initiative.

Council must now hear members of the public who wish to present their submission in person and then decide whether any changes will be made to the Annual Plan before it is adopted on 26 June 2019. There are 55 people in total wishing to speak to their submissions.

A spreadsheet outlining grant applications for 2019/20 is attached in Appendix 3. Following the summary of this year's applications is a spreadsheet detailing grants made in the 18/19 year.

## 2. Consultation Document Proposal Analysis

Council consulted the community on the following proposals:

- Reduction in library charges
- Extended pool opening hours
- Change in funding of housing for seniors
- Extra funding for footpath maintenance

Submitters responded to the above proposals, but also provided feedback on other items not consulted on.

Councillors need to be mindful that feedback provided by submitters may include suggestions that Council has not consulted all ratepayers on. In some cases, particularly where budgetary changes are required, the best course of action is to refer the suggestion to officers for investigation (financial impact and consultation requirements). Councillors may direct officers to action requests where there is clearly no financial impact, need for consultation, or further analysis.

### 2.1 General comments:

The following tables provide some basic analysis of the responses received.

### 2.2 Reduction in library charges

Whilst the Council's preference was for Option 3, the majority of respondents preferred Option 2 – the removal of rental for adult fiction, charge for replacement card, overdue fees for children and youth.

At least 10% of respondents didn't agree with the removal of penalties for books not being returned on time as could lead to people to act irresponsibly, whilst others felt that such action could result in others not having access to particular books for long periods of time. Others commented that any additional revenue received by the library should go back to the community, for example, supporting volunteers in the library or the purchase of more books.

Carterton District Council (CDC) also consulted on these options and have advised that most of their submitters support option 3 with option 2 being the second preferred option. As we together form the Wairarapa Library Service, the way forward for both councils should be aligned. The CDC hearing date is the 29 May 2019.

### 2.3 Extended pool opening hours

The majority of respondents agree that the pools should be opened longer and about 62% of those people agreed with the proposed revision of hours. Only 7 people would like to see proposed pool opening hours reduced.

### 2.4 Change in funding of housing for seniors

Almost 2/3 of respondents agreed with the proposed change in funding for housing for seniors. 10 people suggested increasing rents, 5 others suggested it was a Central Government responsibility.

### 2.5 Extra footpath maintenance

65 respondents supported extra footpath maintenance, however only 42% would be prepared to pay the increased cost from their rates.

## 2.6 Priority ratings

Submitters were asked to rank the options from '1 to 4', with '1' being the highest priority for spending. This means that the option with the **lowest** score is the highest priority to submitters. There is very little difference between any of the initiatives in terms of perceived priorities, with results from submitters as follows:

\*12 single responses from 96 responses, or 12.5% of those that answered this question.

Some submissions have been entered with results 'data smoothed', as blanks would falsely elevate an option. Submissions where data smoothing has been applied have been shown on the summary spreadsheet in a darker blue.
