E Representation Reports

E1. Mayor's Report

Mayor Staples asked for guidance on the request from Aratoi for a letter of support on the proposal to repatriate a South Wairarapa waka which is currently housed at Te Papa, Wellington. Repatriation would involve an extension of museum facilities and housing the waka in the South Wairarapa was beyond Councils financial capability. The request would be placed on the next Maori Standing Committee meeting agenda for discussion.

Mayor Staples sought feedback on a request from the Cross Creek Railway Society to jointly host the opening of the renovated mini fell site and the Featherston Town Square in September.

Councillors discussed the smokefree outdoor dining promotion proposal with councillors. Cr Davies queried the seriousness of the campaign given that it was being held in late autumn/winter and most diners would be sitting inside. Cr Riddell thought Council could be wrongly associated with the promotion and be perceived as an enforcer of the initiative.

Cr Craig

Wairarapa Road Safety Council, Wellington Region Waste Forum

Cr Craig had included a Wellington Region Waste Forum report in the Council papers and highlighted the Forum request to approve funds to appoint a regional waste management officer to implement outstanding waste minimisation actions. Councillors discussed the Wairarapa Waste Coordinator vacancy, and Mr Crimp reported that all Wairarapa councils were currently reviewing what they needed from this role.

Cr Napier

SportNZ Rural Travel Fund, Wairarapa Safer Community Trust

Cr Napier gave a verbal report from a recent meeting of the Wairarapa Safer Community Trust. An extensive youth survey had been carried out and data was currently being analysed by Massey University. Funding was currently being sought from various agencies to support the Trust's social programmes.

Cr Riddell

Healthy Homes, Wairarapa Library Service Committee

Cr Riddell had included a Wairarapa Library Service Committee report in the Council papers.

Cr Stevens

Wairarapa Rural Fire Board

Cr Stevens tabled a report from the Wairarapa Rural Fire Board. A fire appliance had been purchased for Morrinsville and funding was being sought to build a fire depot at Tinui. Along with a restructure of rural fire, it was anticipated that the funding model would be different for future years.

Cr Montgomerie

Economic Development Task Force, Cobblestones Museum

Cr Montgomerie gave a verbal report from a recent meeting of Cobblestones Museum.

Emergency Services Working Party, Community Safety and Resilience Working Party, Wairarapa Policies Working Group

Mayor Staples gave a verbal update on civil defence matters. Martinborough community response planning was building momentum and community led initiatives were being encouraged. Council's role in an emergency would primarily be infrastructure based.

Cr Napier reported that the Gambling Venues Policy was being released for consultation and the change Council requested had been addressed.

Cr Riddell had included a Community Safety and Resilience Working Party report in the Council papers and noted that a representative from Youth in Education Training and Employment (YETE) would be presenting at the next meeting.

Waiohine Floodplain Management Planning Advisory Committee

Cr Napier reported that the Committee had recommended to GWRC a zero rates increase for the Waiohine River scheme due to large funding reserves. Screening of river rock was no longer allowed in the river beds and a draft River Management hearings panel had been setup from members of the Committee.

Awhea Opouawe Scheme Committee

Cr Jephson reported that the Committee had recently held their AGM. Fuller's Bridge and Ushers Hill were of interest to the Committee.

Lower Valley Development Scheme Advisory Committee

A meeting was scheduled for the week commencing 23 May 2016.

Wairarapa Moana Wetlands Co-ordinating Committee

The Committee had not met.

Whaitua Committee

Cr Olds had attended a modelling workshop with the Infrastructure and Services Group Manager. The showcased models gave stakeholders an understanding of the whole Whaitua process. Geology, overland and underground water flows, nitrates and phosphorus flow models were merged into a regional model to show how water works in the region.

Cr Olds had registered for an electric vehicle symposium and had successfully negotiated with Trust House Masterton an agreement to install a rapid charge electric car charging block in the Featherston Gateway carpark.
