DECISION

This is an application by **The Black Sheep Company 2010 Limited** for a renewal on-licence in respect of premises situated at **53 Main Street, Greytown**, known as **"Turkey Red"**

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act and we grant the applicant a renewal on-licence authorising the sale and supply of liquor for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises.

CONDITIONS

The following conditions are consistent with the style of on licence sought

1. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine
2. Alcohol may be sold and supplied on the premises on such days and during such hours as the premises are being operated as a Wine Bar but not other than on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 7.00 am to 1.00 am the following day
3. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers while the premises are open for business at the following place or places: **At the bar and on the tables.**
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages.
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: **At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.**

6. The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
7. The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol
8. The licences must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons
