**BEFORE THE SOUTH WAIRARAPA DISTRICT LICENSING COMMITTEE**

**DECISION**

This is an application by **David and Gaz Investments Limited** for a BYO on-licence in respect of premises situated at **74-76 Main Street, Greytown**, known as "**Aroma India**". The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of a BYO restaurant..

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

**ENDORSEMENT:**

**Section 37** of the Act applies to this licence; and the licensee is also authorised to—

- let any person who is on the premises to dine consume any alcohol brought there by that person or by any other person who is there to dine with him or her; and
- let the person who brought the alcohol to the premises remove any of it from the restaurant if the container it is in is sealed or resealed; and
- sell and supply, for consumption on the premises by any person who is there to dine, any food or hot drink containing not more than 14.33% alcohol by volume; and
- let people consume alcohol on the premises.

**CONDITIONS OF LICENCE**

The licence is subject to the following conditions

1. No alcohol is to be consumed on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine
2. Alcohol may be consumed on the premises only on the following days and during the following hours:  
**Monday to Sunday 11.00am to 12.00midnight**
3. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers at all times while the premises are open for business.
4. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the consumption of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.
5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages
6. The Licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
7. The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed

8. The Licensee must display:

- a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
- b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
- c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

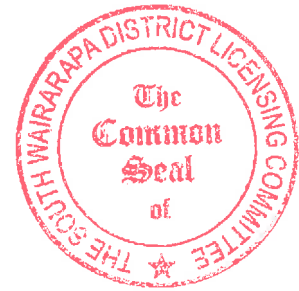
THE LICENSED PREMISES

## ON-LICENCE

*Sections 14-16 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012*

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (The Act), **DAVID AND GAZ INVESTMENTS LIMITED** is authorised to allow consumption of alcohol on the premises situated at **74-76 Main Street, Greytown, 5712** and known as "**AROMA INDIA**",

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with with section 212 of subpart 7 of the Act.

### **ENDORSEMENT:**

Section 37 of the Act applies to this licence; and the licensee is also authorised to—

- let any person who is on the premises to dine consume any alcohol brought there by that person or by any other person who is there to dine with him or her; and
- let the person who brought the alcohol to the premises remove any of it from the restaurant if the container it is in is sealed or resealed; and
- sell and supply, for consumption on the premises by any person who is there to dine, any food or hot drink containing not more than 14.33% alcohol by volume; and
- let people consume alcohol on the premises.

### CONDITIONS OF LICENCE

The licence is subject to the following conditions

1. No alcohol is to be consumed on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine
2. Alcohol may be consumed on the premises only on the following days and during the following hours:  
**Monday to Sunday 11.00am to 12.00midnight**
3. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers at all times while the premises are open for business.
4. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the consumption of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.
5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of liquor, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages
6. The Licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
7. The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed
8. The Licensee must display:
  - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
  - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
  - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises.

### THE LICENSED PREMISES

The premises, situated at **74-76 Main Street, Greytown** are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the South Wairarapa District Licensing Committee on **3<sup>rd</sup> day of July 2015**.

### DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from **74-76 Main Street, Greytown, 5712** is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provision of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force –

(a) Either –

i. Until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or

ii. If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but

(b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either –

i. Until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or

If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.
