DECISION

This is an application by **Catherine Elizabeth Sullivan - Three Black Rabbits** for an on-licence in respect of premises situated at **1512 Sate Highway 2, RD 1, Featherston 5771**, known as "**The Tin Hut - Country Local**"

The general nature of the business to be undertaken is that of a **Restaurant & Bar**.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and I grant the applicant an on-licence authorising the sale and supply of liquor for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises.

The applicant's attention is drawn to ss.56, 57 and 214 (3) of the Act obliging the holder of an on-licence to display:-

1. At each principal entrance to the premises a sign attached to the inside or outside of the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the entrance, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol; AND
2. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through each principal entrance; AND
3. A sign prominently displayed inside the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The premises, situated at **1512 Sate Highway 2, RD 1, Featherston 5771** are more precisely identified in a plan date stamped as received by the South Wairarapa District Licensing Committee on **20 May 2016**.

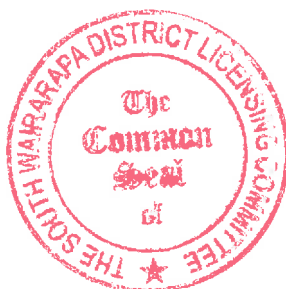
CONDITIONS OF LICENCE

The licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours: **Monday to Sunday 11.00am to 1.00 am the following day**
2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine.
3. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge
4. The Licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.
6. A properly appointed certificated or Acting or Temporary Manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed-in the premises.
7. The Licensee must provide information, advice and assistance about alternative forms of transport available to patrons from the licensed premises.
8. The Licensee must display:
 - a. At every point of sale, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons;
 - b. At the principal entrance to the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the premises, a sign stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for sale of alcohol;
 - c. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises

These conditions are consistent with the style of On-licence.

ON-LICENCE

(for premises)

Sections 14 to 16 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (The Act), **Catherine Elizabeth Sullivan – Three Black Rabbits** is authorised to sell and supply liquor on the premises situated at **1512 Sate Highway 2, RD 1, Featherston, 5771** and known as **"The Tin Hut – Country Local"**, to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The general nature of the business conducted under the licence is a **Restaurant & Bar**

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with with subpart 7 of part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE

The licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours: **Monday to Sunday 11.00am to 1.00 am the following day**
2. No alcohol is to be sold or supplied on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person other than a person who is on the premises to dine.
3. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge
4. The Licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages.
5. DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from **1512 State Highway 2, Featherston** is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provision of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force –

- (a) Either –
 - i. Until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - ii. If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either –
 - i. Until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or

If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.
