Submission to South Wairarapa District Council's 1918-28 Long Term Plan.

Preamble

At the outset, Martinborough Dark Sky Society members want to place on record their thanks to Her Worship, Mayor Viv Napier, councillor colleagues and senior officials, together with Martinborough Community Board and Maori Standing Committee members, for their demonstrated support for the southern Wairarapa Dark Sky Reserve proposal.

Our objectives, to "preserve, protect, enhance and promote" the wonderful night sky views of this region, have met with consistent enthusiasm from all quarters to date.

We hope our proposal to seek formal international recognition from the world regulatory body, the International Dark Sky Association (IDA), for a top level "Gold Standard" dark sky reserve _ a move we can support with expert dark sky measurement data _ will garner further interest and enthusiasm from the wider South Wairarapa community.

As initial recognition, the IDA has already awarded Martinborough "3K City" status for its upgraded street and highway lighting reconfiguration _ the first such accolade for a New Zealand centre.

Local businesses, including the Top 10 Holiday camp site, Big Sky Wines and Luna Wines, Mitre 10 and Pain&Kershaw, Tranzit, Martinborough Golf Club, and the Martinborough Business Association, as well as the Community Board, Maori Standing Committee, high value accommodation providers, private citizens and groups like Lions and a Martinborough business luncheon club have already shown significant interest in the project.

Submission

Martinborough Dark Sky Society is keen to support and promote all of the above objectives through its work in establishing a dark sky reserve.

There is a world-wide trend for increasing light pollution, with 80 percent of North American and European citizens now unable to see the Milky Way at night. New Zealand, with lower population and roading density, still has significant areas where the night sky can be clearly seen.

At a time when half the world's people can't see the stars at night, a key to the Society reaching its goals is the significant buy-in demonstrated by the SWDC's involvement.

A recent meeting with senior officials hosted by Mayor Napier clearly indicated the lack of regulatory control the council has over exterior lighting _ domestic and business, despite an ordinance requiring certain lighting lux (brightness) levels at the boundary of a property.

Our country depends strongly on a clean, green image – "100% Pure" – so protecting the values of the night-time environment fits the character of the New Zealand image.

The problem: no ability on the part of SWDC to enforce any meaningful lighting standards, with the dark sky reserve proposal facing slow erosion over time of the wonderful dark skies we presently enjoy.

Therefore we urge the council to adopt already-established outdoor lighting policies and practices that have been shown to reduce light pollution while providing sufficient light for all of our outdoor activities at night.

We wish to also alert the council to the cultural risks which are not yet considered in these critical decision-making processes: specifically, relating to Article Two of the Treaty of Waitangi.

Māori, Pasifika and Indigenous people around the world, for thousands of years have maintained an interconnected relationship with the sky. Many still use the sky as a tool by which to gather and plant food, as well as to share narratives gather data.

The night, Te Pō, is in our genealogy lineage "Whakapapa;" therefore, the night sky is taonga (a treasure) and protected under the treaty agreement. Depleting access to this is a very serious concern to the cultural heritage and livelihood of many peoples.

The trend of increasing light pollution in New Zealand is similar to that the rest of the world, so we only have a small head start on saving our view of the night sky.

Three areas of concern

There are three broad areas of significant concern exist regarding outdoor lighting and light pollution.

- --Visibility of the night sky and the connection this makes for our children's curiosity and learning, as well as our communities' cultural connections to the night sky. A full 86 percent of New Zealanders live in urban areas lit with outdoor light at night.
- -- The known and suspected threats to our health presented by light pollution. This is particularly true as concerns our children, which recent research indicates suffer disproportionately. There are aslso the impacts on all our circadian rhythms which control our sleep/wake cycles. Interrupting this system with artificial light at night is recognised to have physical and mental health impacts.
- -- The disruption to our native wildlife behaviour. By trying to turn night time into day we are confusing the natural behaviours and patterns of native wildlife and impacting their feeding strategies, defensive behaviours and reproduction cycles. We're probably also impacting their health through sleep deprivation.

Outdoor lighting policies

Poorly designed and installed lighting costs the world economy billions of dollars each year. Therefore, we encourage the SWDC to implement outdoor lighting policies on both public and private properties.

The International Dark-Sky Association, the recognised global authority on matters relating to light pollution, offers a Model Lighting Ordinance 12 (MLO) on which such policies may be patterned. This model policy was developed in collaboration with the Illuminating Engineering Society, another international organization representing lighting engineers and designers.

Policies similar to the MLO are already in use in New Zealand; communities in the International Dark Sky Reserve at Tekapo on the South Island, for instance, enacted outdoor lighting restrictions three and a half decades ago.

Range of Work by Martinborough Dark Sky Society

The Society is involved in a range of voluntary activities in its efforts to create a Martinborough Dark Sky Reserve.

Members have surveyed night-time light and darkness levels across the proposed reserve area, from the SWDC northern boundary to the coast on the east and south and along the Ruamahanga River. This work has confirmed the high quality or "gold standard" darkness level currently in place. This submission is to spark lighting ordinance action to ensure it is preserved, protected and enhanced.

Some members are already installing astronomy observation domes and telescopes, some highly sophisticated, for night sky viewing, astrophotography and to support tourism activity.

The executive group has advanced plans for a "Dark Sky Friendly" campaign for business, including retail, accommodation and hospitality providers, tourism sector operators, vineyards and other growers to be able to publicly demonstrate their support for the initiative.

It includes voluntary reviewing of business lighting plans, offering options to ensure "dark sky friendly" changes arte made and monitoring ongoing progress.

Participants will be awarded "Dark Sky Friendly" annual window and product stickers (for example on wine and olive oil bottles, or on shop lighting merchandise) in return for their participation. Already several businesses are ready to join the scheme and have their participation logged on the Society's web site for visitors to note.

Several other initiatives are also under way, including cooperatively connecting with other reserves throughout New Zealand and selected international dark sky reserve groups.

The group also raised funding to bring Dr John Barentine, director of the International Dark Sky Association, to Martinborough from the U.S. as part of a consultation that included Kahungunu ki Wairarapa and its plan for an astronomy and star compass centre in the southern coastal area.

Summary

Limiting the use of outdoor light to only the times and places where it is needed for the performance of outdoor tasks, and in the amount and light spectrum appropriate to those tasks, is the most effective way to reduce both light pollution as well as the impact of outdoor lighting use on climate change.

As an added benefit, this approach contributes positively toward preserving the integrity of dark night skies for which New Zealand is increasingly known and admired throughout the world.

Our local government structure needs to be fully informed of its lighting control options and equipped to make the best possible decisions on behalf of its citizens.

Furthermore, New Zealand's environmental policies should be reviewed and updated to include protection of the night-time environment and to give effective guidance to the rules and regulations that are needed to care for the intrinsic values and functions of our night.

We view these strategies as a win-win proposition for all stakeholders.

Taking these steps will position our region at the forefront of the "pack" with respect to light

pollution control policy, and materially improve the wellbeing and quality of life for all our citizens.

Some allocation of annual funding will be an essential part of the SWDC's policy response, to provide the necessary expertise and working capital required to develop the necessary regulatory framework.

The Society notes it has been entirely self-funding to this point.

At a recent meeting with McKenzie District Council (Tekapo) Mayor Graham Smith he noted the council there had contributed \$25,000 every two years to the funding of the Tekapo group which worked to establish the district's (and the world's) first Dark Sky Reserve. It also won funding from Christchurch Airport, Cantertbury University and other entities.

This group is at the point where some public funding of its initiative likely will be essential for it to continue the rapid progress it has made on what is a regional development project. Tekapo is now at the point where 1 million of its 2.4 million annual visitors travel there for the dark sky experience it offers.

We respectfully ask for your earnest consideration of these matters.

Martinborough Dark Sky Society _ Minutes of meeting 27 February 2018 Lions' Club

Chairman Lee Mauger outlined progress made since the founding meeting of the Society:

- The Martinborough Dark Sky Society has been registered as a not-for-profit friendly society.
- The International Dark Sky Society (IDA) has awarded Martinborough "3K City" status _ the first such accolade in New Zealand _ after the decision to replace all public lighting with lights compliant with its 3,000K requirement.
- The lighting change to 3,000K from the proposed 4,000K plan throughout the main Wairarapa towns and highways was outlined, along with the move to comply with the IDA requirement adopted by the New Zealand Transport Agency;
- International publicity for the Martinborough dark sky movement by the IDA through its web blog was welcomed, as was the report in Guernsey newspapers of the move by the Society to develop an international-quality dark sky reserve.
- Support for the Society's proposed reserve has been provided by the South Wairarapa District Council _ led by an enthusiastic Mayor Viv Napier _ as well as by the Martinborough Community Board and the SWDC's Maori Standing Committee. All three bodies have put their support in written form, ably demonstrating local government buy-in to the project _ a key requirement for IDA recognition of the planned dark sky reserve application.
- The Society has provided lighting ordnance input to SWDC after a meeting where it acknowledged its current ordnance gave it little or no control over commercial or private lighting throughout the community. Lighting ordnance material from Tekapo and IDA were provided to council officers. The need for changes to the District Plan's lighting ordnance rules was also emphasised.
- The "Dark Sky Friendly" programme to engage the Society with the business community was outlined, along with reports of initial keen responses from business owners, including Big Sky Wines, Top 10 Holiday Park, Martinborough Golf Club and Cool Change restaurant/bar.
- Committee member John Whitby provided details of his dark sky measurement programme throughout the 1,550 square kilometre area proposed to form the core of the MDS Reserve. His measurements confirmed the region contains some of the world's best dark skies _ enabling the Society to pursue a "Gold" standard dark sky reserve accreditation from IDA.

The measurement document is attached for members' information.

- Maori Committee members who attended the meeting outlined their interest in developing a Maori Navigation project site near Lake Ferry. This would help explain ancient Maori navigation of the Pacific Ocean and ancestor voyaging to Aotearoa by navigators like Kupe, who made two voyages and landings on the South Wairarapa coastal area.

- Discussions with Dept of Conservation staff on the inclusion of Aorangi Reserve in the dark sky reserve were outlined. DOC staff are pursuing details of the DOC-Great Barrier Island reserve agreement for possible application to the Martinborough reserve area.
- The impact of 4,000K lighting's blue spectrum on sky viewing, Cicadian rhythms, human sleeping patterns, and wildlife disruption were discussed. The region-wide change to 3,000K lighting was applied by committee members.
- IDA director John Barentine is being brought to New Zealand to tour dark sky reserve areas and will speak publicly in **Martinborough on May 5** as part of a tour funded by the US Embassy after a request by the chairman. **Add to diaries**.
- Chairman Lee Mauger was to meet with Victoria University senior administrators to discuss scientific projects allied to the dark sky reserve as part of a plan to further foster scientific involvement in the region.
- Committee member Haami Te Whaiti agreed to pursue discussions with Maritime New Zealand officials over the lighting changes planned for Cape Palliser _ seen as prospectively having a serious impact on the southern coastal segment of the dark sky reserve area.
- Local lwi Maori input has been sought for a name for the Dark Sky Reserve that links Maori and pakeha regional influences. A dual Maori-English language name is seen as the preferred option.

Kupe, Aorangi and Tuhirangi were briefly discussed as options.

- The impact of possible 4,000K street lighting being introduced throughout Wellington could be signficant for the western edge of the proposed dark sky reserve. The IDA's Barentine has already intervened after being alerted to the misuse of IDA regulations by Wellington City Council.
- The Royal Society of New Zealand is undertaking research into night lighting and its impacts. This research is expected to endorse lower levels of public lighting as "best practice" for human health and wildlife well-being.

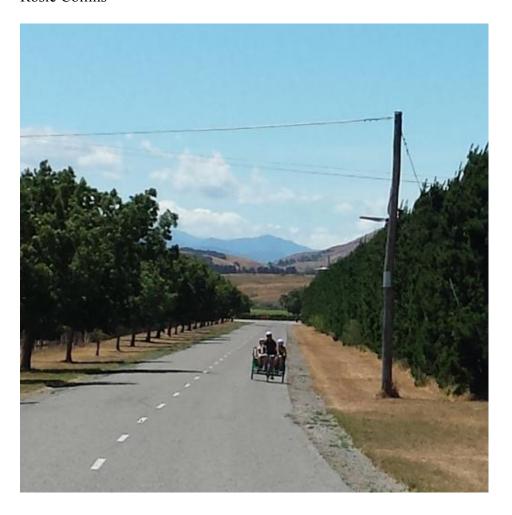
I wish to submit a request for cycle paths around the Martinborough vineyards.

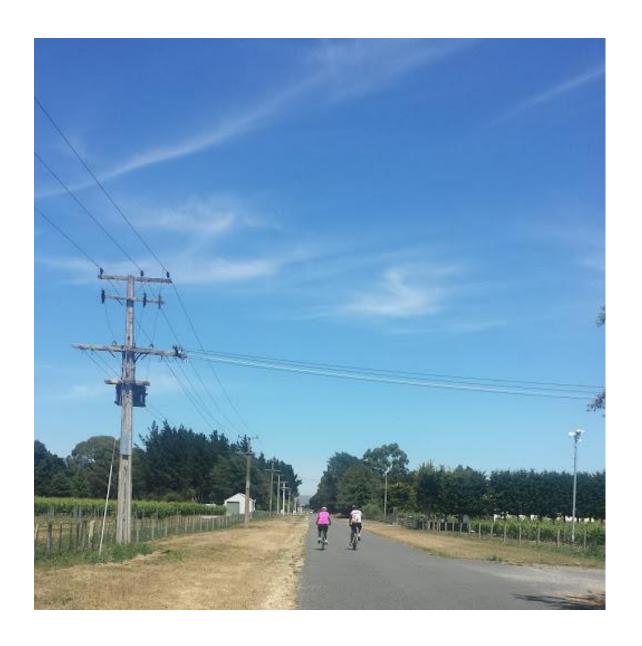

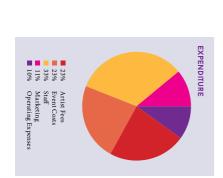

I have raised this problem with Council several times commenting that the flow of storm water at the corner of Dublin and Sackville Streets in Martinborough fails to meet the above objective. Photographic and video footage (available on request) from recent weather events (Tuesday 10 April) shows that this corner is a significant problem area and rather than running freely as it does on the opposite corner, stormwater congregates in this low lying place and flows back into my property. Recent repairs to the curb did little to improve this situation.

Re: The Featherston Domain/One Tree Reserve

Relevance to the four pillars of the strategic plan:

- Best care and use of natural resources.
- 2. Best care and use of **assets and infrastructure**

Summary

The Featherston Domain (the domain) welcomes all to Featherston and the southern Wairarapa from the Rimutakas. It is generally a verdant area of bush with trails comprising a combination of native and non-native flora and fauna.

As is apparent from the attached images, the majority of the domain is of a height that allows the significant 'One Tree' to be viewed, especially when approaching Featherston from the North and East. It is also apparent from the images that there is a block of trees that have been allowed to grow much taller than the remainder of trees on the domain.

These trees adversely impact the attractiveness and enjoyment of the domain for visitors to the southern Wairarapa and the local community. The trees, and in particular a specific coppice of wilding pines, impact upon the wellbeing of the residents of Featherston living in their shadow.

Submission

- 1. Management of the block of trees on the domain, to be included in the Long Term Plan.
- 2. Immediate action to be taken regarding the coppice of wilding pines.

The submission is set out in two parts:

1. The block of trees on the domain

The block of trees, referred to in the summary, is visibly higher than the remainder of the domain. The rationale for this disparity is not known. It is believed that the development of Featherston, north of Renall Street, was a factor in the management of the remainder of the domain.

The trees impact on the natural resource that is the domain. The non-native nature of the majority of the trees in the featured block, has resulted in their foliage creating a dense canopy through which little natural light can penetrate. The forest floor is dark and dank and typically lacks any obvious life. The contrast with the remainder of the domain is readily noticeable if one walks the trail to the summit. When you leave the featured block of trees, the amount of natural light increases and the forest floor is more verdant. As a result, the latter section of the trail is more enjoyable, interesting and welcoming for visitors and the local community alike.

The height and density of the trees impacts on the local families that live in their shadow. The track of the sun, in this part of southern Wairarapa, is such that the sun rises over the main part

of Featherston, tracks across the domain, before setting behind the Rimutakas. During the autumn and, especially the winter months, the height and density of the featured block of trees has an impact on the available sunlight within the southern end of Featherston.

In brief, the local families that live on the west side of SH2, from the town perimeter to approximately Renall Street, are deprived of some or all of the available sunlight during the months that the sun tracks lower in the sky.

It is inevitable that due to the track of the sun there will be some compromise when living up against or close to the domain. Indeed, the amount of available sunlight varies from house to house due to positioning. However, a simple reduction in height and density of the featured block of trees on the domain would increase the available sunlight and improve the wellbeing of a number of the local families in this part of Featherston.

Requested action

- a. South Wairarapa District Council accepts that the featured block of trees on the domain is detrimental to the best use of natural resources within Featherston and/or is negatively impacting upon the wellbeing of a proportion of the community of Featherston;
- b. South Wairarapa District Council commits to reducing the height and density of the block of trees on the domain as part of the Long Term Plan 2018/2019, in order to:
 - i. Improve the natural light to the floor of the domain; and
 - ii. Improve the availability of direct sunlight to local families so affected; and
 - iii. Improve the aesthetic of the domain in general, enhancing the district.

2. The coppice of wilding pines

Within the featured block of trees on the domain is a loose circle of what appear to be wilding pine trees. There are 8 or 9 trees in the coppice. It is understood that the trees were originally planted some decades ago, as a local school project, but have not been 'managed' in any way. Left unchecked, the wilding pines have grown very tall and dominate the tree line of the featured block of trees. The attached images demonstrate the height of the coppice of trees, above and beyond the rest of the block.

Similar to the rest of the featured block of trees on the domain, the forest floor beneath the coppice is dark and dank because of the density of the canopy of pines and the acidic effect of the needles; the contrast with the rest of the domain, which enjoys more light because of the preponderance of native trees and plants, is stark.

As specified by DoC, wilding pines are an invasive weed; compete for space with native trees and plants; and can be visually intrusive in native forest areas. It is submitted that this coppice 'ticks all the boxes' set out by DoC. In addition, the height and density of the coppice is particularly responsible for the significant loss of direct sunlight, experienced by a proportion of Featherston residents, when the sun tracks lower in the sky during the autumn and winter months.

Requested action

a. South Wairarapa District Council accepts that the coppice of wilding pines is having a detrimental impact on the Featherston domain and/or is negatively impacting upon the well-being of a proportion of the community of Featherston;

- b. South Wairarapa District Council commits to the removal or vigorous thinning of the coppice in order to:
 - i. Improve the natural light to the floor of the section of the domain; and
 - ii. Immediately improve the well-being of affected families during the autumn and winter months; and
 - iii. Rid the Featherston domain of some invasive species.
- c. South Wairarapa District Council commits to implementing this activity as soon as possible, preferably in the annual plan for 2018-2019. Alternatively, at the latest, within the annual plan for 2019-2020.

Costs

To mitigate the costs of removal and disposal of the timber for the council, there appears to be a couple of options. One suggestion is that because the wilding pines were originally planted by a local school, disposal of the timber could be managed through a fund-raising activity, e.g. selling the timber as firewood. This approach would return the timber, or some benefits from it, to the local community or to council for redistribution.

Support for the submission

The subject matter of this submission was raised with the Featherston Community Board at the March 2018 board meeting. It received the support of the Featherston Community Board; as set out in the attached letter dated 20 March 2018. We also attach signatures from local residents expressing their support.

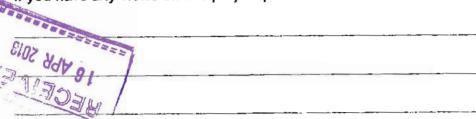

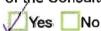

I am writing this submission as a private individual to provide my view on the proposed LTP. In making the submission I wish it to noted that whilst we have a precis of the complete documentation around the Plan it can give us a complete view of the Council's strategy, however the paper is sufficient to enable a submission to be undertaken.

The first to note is for Featherston ratepayers the notable increase in rates by 7.2%. This is substantial and I believe Council should broaden it's scope for rate collection so that ratepayers have an opportunity to consider more frequent but smaller payemnts to cover this not inconsiderable cost. Whilst this may be a practise already there has never been a real promotion that encourages people on fixed incomes to address this. The high level goals such as minimisation of waste through education providing for e-waste at transfer stations along with useable goods for resale. This is a simple but effective matter. Rather than add to the kerbside pick up we could increase the hours the transfer stations operate. It would be fair to say most people can access the transfer stations so improving the hours and facility to dispose of waste through there is obvious.

Water conservation should also be education rather than regulation.

Wastewater is another matter and knowing the difficulty in gaining consent for Featherston has shown a lack of imagination on behalf of SWDC and it's officials and although we as residents have asked Council to look for more sustainable solutions there has been a lack of willingness to do so. I would rather see a staged development with new ponds being built with the appropriate treatment before the second stage of disposal is agreed with residents. Disposal to featherston golf club is a sound opportunity with a good example being the Mirimar Golf Course in Wellington. The over purchase of land in Murphys Line could be amended and sold to provide monies for the first stage development.

The continual drain on resources through NZTA has been an ongoing and costly exercise for many years and will continue to do so until a better long term solution is found. This effect of tourism using that road to Ngawi has not been well understood and whilst a flash point of even more serious issue is the Wairarapa side of the Remutaka Hill Road. It is not obvious to ratepayers that any thought for this issue has been made by Council and unless real effort to address this matter we will see the number of tourist drop. I wish you to note that emergency frequently used weekend is undertaken by Featherston volunteers and Council has done little to understand the effect of this negligence has had on those stalwarts who turn out for accidents every week.

Council has failed to consider our young people in South Wairarapa although having free swimming this year was a very successful strategy. The problems youth encounter in this modern age are such that I support funding a youth person having a person Featherston who is managing this in all three towns has already borne much fruit. WE have no strong police presence in South Wairarapa and this ongoing issue must be address by Council.

Whilst I believe in promoting South Wairarapa unless this Council changes it's culture to one of supporting and promoting business in all three towns you must forget it. Featherston is the gateway to the Wairarapa and has suffered greatly from neglect and a lack of heeding the calls from residents and business. Whilst Council may well be proud of it's draconian rules as Paul Crimp stated clearly unlike Carterton and Masterton the net effect is an unhappy community that whilst striving to improve business employment opportunities the constant NO from officials must stop. I would like to see a massive cultural change from NO to how can we help you achieve your goals.

This Plan unfortunately gives me no hope this will occur and in fact tells me something different. I seek Councillors to be firm and steadfast in seeking the culture change that must occur to improve outcomes in South Wairarapa

I attended a meeting at the SWDC rooms in Martinborough to discuss the LTP. I spoke briefly about the lack of any visible provision in the LTP of the views of tangata whenua or indeed that they had played a key role in developing the LTP. The CEO acknowledged that this was an obvious omission in the LTP but said that the Council had a "Maori standing committee" and they have input into Council planning and activities. Whilst this may be the case the fruits of their (Maori Standing Cttee) labours are rather invisible and not at all promoted in the plan or in the Community.

In acknowledging the exclusion of local Maori into the LTP, the CEO mentioned that dual language street names were being considered and one other "Maori-related" initiative (the subject of which escapes me!). I consider these to be token matters in the xtreme and that the true involvement of tangata whenua in the LTP has been ignored. I had some involvement with the Wellington Regional Council and the Hutt City Council in planning to improve the health of the Waiwhetu Stream; this was a \$30million project. The involvement of local iwi (in this case Te Atiawa) was

paramount and they were actively involved in the planning and direction of the programme - not just advised of what was proposed by the Regional Council and Hutt City and their comments sought (another name for "consultation"!) SWDC could do well to seek the views of local iwi as to HOW they want to be involved in the present operations and future strategic direction of the SWDC. This is fundamental to meeting the Treaty of Waitangi obligations and indeed for respectful cohabitation of this whenua.

It's not easy and there will be challenges - but it is about respect.

I would like to encourage SWDC to include a commitment to involve local iwi, tangata whenua, in the LTP together with a plan as to how this will be achieved.

I am concerned about the lack of small housing in South Wairarapa both for the elderly and first-time buyers. There are very few opportunities to purchase smaller, cheaper housing, and the lack of such housing drives up the price of available properties.

I have personally witnessed nine elderly people who have moved out of Greytown to obtain smaller properties. This is a weakness, as we are not catering to the need of the elderly section of our community, many of whom live in large houses, because of the lack of an alternative.

The problem would seem to lie with the district plan, as at present town houses, under 500 square metres cannot be built. This is not the case in Masterton and Carterton, where successful sub divisions have been built, catering for this need.

I am urging council to consider this matter as a priority. There is at present no mention of this in the Long Term Plan and I am fearful that it might take years for spatial planning to consider this matter. I urge the council to see this as a priority if we are to cater for the needs of a significant section of our community, whose vulnerability can only increase during the next decade.

ABOUT SPORT NZ

Sport New Zealand (Sport NZ) is the crown entity responsible for getting more New Zealanders physically active, keeping competitive sport strong, clean and fair, and ensuring there are pathways for our most talented sportspeople to realise their potential.

Our research shows that participation in sport and recreation is declining (down 7.7% among all New Zealand adults between 1998 and 2014). This trend is particularly profound among:

- Young adults (18-24) down 13.9%
- Pacific (11.4%) and Māori (8.4%) communities
- Households with combined incomes under \$40,000 pa
- Men (down 9.2% v a drop of 6.4% for women)

We are now into the third year of our Community Sport Strategy, which has put a strong emphasis on using research to better understand how societal changes and the changing make-up of New Zealand's population impact the level and nature of participation in sport and recreation. We are working with regional sports trusts, councils and other local stakeholders to find local solutions to turn this around.

Community sport and recreational opportunities need to be sustained in partnership with others, such as: charitable trusts, the Ministry of Education (via schools), and community groups and clubs.

Maintaining aging assets, current service levels and facility sustainability is becoming increasingly difficult, especially for areas with minimal growth / or aging populations. Partnering, co-location and shared services that avoid unnecessary duplication and underutilisation of sports and recreational facilities needs to continue and rationalisation of poor performing facilities should be considered.

THE IMPORTANCE OF COUNCILS TO OUR APPROACH

Councils play a key role in our focus on young people. They are an important partner for Sport NZ regional sports trusts, in whom we are a significant investor and partner – and who are the regional champions of our strategy to grow participation.

Sport NZ also supports councils in the delivery of major events, and councils are now increasingly involved in running or supporting local programmes drive local physical activity and wellbeing outcomes.

However, our key area of work with councils – and the primary way your Long-Term Plan 2018-28 can help grow participation in sport and recreation – remains the planning, investment and operation of the facilities and open spaces which enable sport and recreation.

For instance, our most recent Active NZ study (2014) found that more 30% of women use a swimming pool as part of their sport and recreation, more than half of all adults use an indoor or outdoor sporting facility, and just under a quarter of adults cycle for sport and recreation.

That's why Sport NZ is working with its Regional Sports Trust partners and councils to develop Regional Spaces and Places Plans, including the Wellington and Wairarapa Regions. This is to ensure that the prioritisation of sport and recreation facilities aligns with both current and future needs, and that they are developed and operated to maximise benefits to the community.

THE VALUE OF SPORT AND RECREATION

On 17 March, Sport NZ launched a <u>new study</u> that explores the value of sport and recreation to New Zealanders, their communities and our country. *The Value of Sport* is based on extensive research, including a survey of around 2,000 New Zealanders and a review of previous studies from here and around the world.

People we spoke to see real value in participating in sport and recreation:

- 92% believe being active keeps them physically fit and healthy, and helps relieve stress
- 88% believe that sport and other physical activities provide them with opportunities to achieve and help build confidence
- 84% believe sport brings people together and create a sense of belonging
- 74% say sport help builds vibrant and stimulating communities.

Our research also showed the ability of sport and recreation to create good young adults and improve the health and wellbeing of New Zealanders. Key findings include:

Sport and physical activity can reduce rates of many physical health related disorders and improve health outcomes as a result

Significant studies have identified relationships between physical activity and reducing type 2 diabetes, high blood pressure, cardiovascular disease and obesity related disorders. Regular physical activity results in similar outcomes for children, including improved cardiovascular fitness, decreased risk of type 2 diabetes, improved bone health, and maintaining a healthy weight. There is at least moderate evidence of physical activity having beneficial impacts on rates of breast cancer, colon cancer, osteoporosis and stroke.

Evidence indicates a positive association between children's physical activity participation and academic achievement

There is a positive association between physical activity and higher test scores, improved reading comprehension and a positive orientation towards achievement. There is also evidence that children can spend more time being physically active and less time in the classroom without having an impact on academic achievement. There is a positive association between sport participation and higher academic performance, attendance rates and less lateness and stand downs.

Participation in sport has been linked with greater employability in graduates.

Sport at university was associated with greater employability compared with attending the gym, or not engaging in sport – and this effect was greater for graduates who take part in sport and volunteering. Employers listed a wide range of attributes developed through sport, including teamwork, communication skills, motivation, competitiveness and resilience.

There is a link between sport participation, improved social capital, feelings of social cohesion and community identity

Because sport acts as a conduit to bring individuals within communities together, to make friends and to develop networks, it also presents an opportunity to develop social capital. There are strong associations between national levels of sport club memberships and levels of social trust and wellbeing. Some evidence also suggests that sport and recreation in youth may also result in increased levels of community involvement as an adult.

OUR SUBMISSION TO YOUR LONG TERM PLAN

We wish to comment on a specific community sport and recreation facility development opportunity and encourage the Council to give it consideration and inclusion in its 2018-28 LTP.

Community/School Partnership – An Indoor Recreation Facility at Kuranui College

Sport NZ supports the concept of developing a new community and school partnership for the construction of an Indoor Sports Facility located at Kuranui College. We see this as being of benefit for all of South Wairarapa residents with also the potential to develop Greytown's sporting and recreation capacity through the development of a sustainable, long term sports hub.

Schools are integral parts of our communities – physically, socially and culturally. They are places where young people develop the knowledge, skills and relationships to participate and contribute to their communities throughout their lives.

Sport New Zealand has developed a National Facility Framework aimed at getting "better value from New Zealand sporting facilities". This framework identifies partnerships and collaboration with the education sector as a critical success factor in providing a network of quality sporting facilities for communities to participate.

Many New Zealand schools and communities benefit from the educational, economic and broader community advantages that flow from shared-facility partnerships, including:

- new or improved and more fit-for-purpose facilities through the pooling of resources and expertise
- more efficient investment and better asset utilisation without duplicating facilities within the same community
- increased access to quality facilities for a range of purposes at a single location stronger social networks and greater community involvement in school activities and student learning
- enhanced reputation of schools within the community and a shared sense of pride in local schools
- improved school security as a result of the increased use of school premises out of school hours a greater sense of community through the shared ownership, operation and maintenance of facilities.

We understand that the existing school gymnasium may be at risk of being partially demolished. This would be of concern as it would have a negative impact in reducing the potential to participate in health education and sporting activities for the South Wairarapa.

The development of sport and recreation facilities through community/school partnerships is consistent with Sport NZ's Community Sports Strategy (2015 – 2020) and aligned to the principles in the National Sporting Facilities Framework and also with the principles of the Ministry of Educations Shared Use Policy (2016).

Both Sport NZ and the MoE support the need to see improved education health and wellbeing outcomes for New Zealand communities and encourage to be proactive in promoting a collaborative partnership and shared use approach for the development of facilities and services.
