#### Water Conservation through use of water tanks.

Greytown is growing quickly and new housing sites are in several parts of town. The increasing use of water will place considerable strain on the town water supply. I recommend that all new homes be obligated to include a water tank. This will lead to to the conservation of water. The water in the tanks could be used for gardening needs.

#### Water Races

Some are kept clean and some are not. We have regularly cleaned our share of the race. Some parts of the town have water races on properties that are unmonitored. Full and efficient documentation nerds to be made and the residents advised and given the same legal warning as rural residents to keep the water race clean.

#### Wood street

The northern side of Wood street from the Blue school to the end of the urban housing. There is no kerbing and channeling of the street in this area. It is a dangerous stretch of road for pedestrians, cyclists and for vehicles. The road is narrow **with many potholes** on the side which makes the passing of oncoming vehicles difficult especially if there are pedestrians and people walking dogs. The berm on this section is wide

#### Bus shelters.

Many older people catch the bus and the train as they do not have a car or do not want to drive beyond the confines of Greytown. Some people also find it difficult to stand for periods of time and buses do not always adhere to the timetable. Bus shelters with seating needs to be provided for people waiting for a bus. The southern side of Wood Street also has no footpaths yet it has a bus stop that necessitates people standing on the wet cold ground whilst waiting for a bus.
