

DECISION ON THE PAPERS

This is an application by The Quiet Man Limited for a Temporary Authority in respect of premises situated at 33 Main Street, Greytown known as "Greytown Hotel".

This is the second Temporary Authority for this applicant. The applicant lodged an application for the substantive Off Licence on the 8th June 2015 and was publicly notified in the Wairarapa Times Age 10th and 17th of June 2015.

The public notice incorrectly advertised the days and hours for the licence as Monday to Friday 10:00am to 11:00pm. The public notice has since been re advertised correctly on the 10th and 17th July 2015.

Because of the delay with the public notification, the temporary authority will expire before the substantive licence can be determined.

This application is required to enable the applicant to continue to trade in the interim.

Police and the Inspector have no opposition to this application. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard, as set out in s.3, s.4 and s.136 of the Act. We grant the Temporary Authority for a period of one month from the issue date.
