DECISION

This is an application by Greytown Football Club Incorporated for a club licence in respect of premises situated at 11-55 Kuratawhiti Street, Greytown, known as "Greytown Football Club".

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly I deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.105 of the Act and I grant the applicant a club licence pursuant to s.21.

REASON FOR DECISION

The Greytown Football Club Incorporated have applied for a Club Licence at 11-55 Kuratawhiti Street Greytown. As a result of the Inspectior's report I am pleased to grant the Licence subject to the following conditions 1-12c. Including the changing rooms as a Designated Area to exclude the consumption of BYO alcohol is commendable.

CONDITIONS

- The Club must have a secretary at all times.
- 2. Within 10 working days of the appointment of a new secretary, the club must inform the secretary of the District Licensing Committee.
- 3. All proceeds from the sale of alcohol belong to the club.
- 4. Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and hours:
 - Saturdays only, from 1:00 pm to 11:00 pm.
 - During the period 1 April and September 30 of any calendar year.
- 5. While the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol no BYO alcohol may be consumed on the premises.
- 6. A properly appointed certified manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol and their name must be prominently displayed.
- 7. Drinking water is to be freely available at all times when the premises is open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
- 8. At all times when the premises are open for selling, supplying or consuming alcohol, there must be a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol drinks available for purchase at reasonable prices.
- 9. Food must be available for consumption at all times the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol. The range must be in accordance with the menu submitted with this application or of a similar range and standard. Food must be actively promoted and available within a reasonable time of ordering.
- 10. Information, advice and assistance about alternative transport options must be freely given to guests on the licensed premise.
- 11. Alcohol can only be sold and supplied to authorised customers or authorised visitors and their guests.
- 12. The licensee must display:
 - a. At each principal entrance to the premises, the ordinary operating hours during which the sale of alcohol is permitted.
 - b. A copy of the licence and all conditions subject to which it is issued, to the inside of the premises so to be easily read by all people entering at each principal entrance.
 - c. At every point of sale for alcohol, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.

CLUB-LICENCE

Sections 21 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (the Act), **Greytown Football Club Incorporated** (the licensee) is authorised to sell and supply alcohol on the premises situated at **11-55 Kuratawhiti Street, Greytown** and known as **"Greytown Football Club"**, for consumption on the premises, to any person who –

- is a member of the club; or
- is on the premises at the invitation of, and is accompanied by, a member of the club; or
- is a member of some other club with which the club has an arrangement for reciprocal visiting rights for members.

The authority conferred by the licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the club in accordance with subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act

CONDITIONS

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- 3. All proceeds from the sale of alcohol belong to the club.
- 4. Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and hours:

Saturdays only, from 1:00 pm to 11:00 pm.

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- 6. A properly appointed certified manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol and their name must be prominently displayed.
- 7. Drinking water is to be freely available at all times when the premises is open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
- 8. At all times when the premises are open for selling, supplying or consuming alcohol, there must be a reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol drinks available for purchase at reasonable prices.
- 9. Food must be available for consumption at all times the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol. The range must be in accordance with the menu submitted with this application or of a similar range and standard. Food must be actively promoted and available within a reasonable time of ordering.
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 - b. A copy of the licence and all conditions subject to which it is issued, to the inside of the premises so to be easily read by all people entering at each principal entrance.
 - c. At every point of sale for alcohol, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The premises, situated at 11-55 Kuratawhiti Street, Greytown, are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the South Wairarapa District Licensing Committee on 13 April 2018.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The upstairs entrance from the carpark is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provisions of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force-

(a) until its expiry date detailed below; OR

(b) if an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence expires, until the close of the period 3 years after the expiry date.
