Safer Wairarapa Coordinator's Report

13 November 2012

Clareville A&P Show

Safer Wairarapa had our first joint tent at the Clareville A&P Show on 27 and 28 October. The tent had resources from all of the work streams and we set up the driveway runover resource out the front of the tent to attract and educate people about driveway runovers. Children were offered balloons and stickers. We had a steady stream of people who engaged in conversations about safety; sat in the car to check out their backing vision; measured their children for childseat safety; took the ACC homesafety checklist; discussed and took a White Ribbon; took pamphlets about good communication and de-stressing. We made contact with rural people wanting to get involved in suicide prevention; we discussed sources of support for parents concerned about their children's drinking and provided the dvd and book. While we blew up and tied up balloons for the children, members of the family wondered around the tent and took information about things they were interested in... and much more.

A big thank you to the Fire service who provided the tent for us all. A special thanks to Henry and Dave who put up and pulled down the tent. Another joint tent is planned for the Show in February.

I have been fortunate enough to attend the Safety 2012 World Conference in Wellington from 1-4 October 2012. One of the key messages I took from it was the importance of the link between safety, public health and the environment and the need to be working collaboratively.

Suicide Prevention

Mike King, Comedian spoke at Kuranui, Wairarapa and Makoura College and the Town Hall on 25 October. About 500 people attended the Town Hall. His message was around bullying, mental wellbeing and communication.

	<p>between one and 34 years old and a major cause of hospitalisations across the population. Injury cost the country an estimated \$10.39 billion in 2010. However, most injuries are preventable.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The rate of fatal injuries has been stable since 2000; however, the composition of these injuries has changed. Road crash fatalities dropped by nearly 30% between 2004 and 2009 and drownings also reduced, but fatal falls increased by around 30% in the same period. - Changes in the composition of serious injuries have been less marked.
