<b>Meeting – Date &amp; Venue</b>	<b>WAIRARAPA ROAD SAFETY COUNCIL</b> 24 APRIL 2018 AT REAP HOUSE, MASTERTON
<b>Key Items</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- <b>Speed:</b> is the UN Global Road Safety theme for <u>Road Safety Week 8-14 May.</u></li> <li>- <u>This year's WRSC theme: "Belts on, Phones off - make it a habit".</u></li> <li>- Draft GPS on Land Transport out for review. <u>Safety is one of the four strategic priorities in the draft GPS</u></li> <li>- <u>Speed Management Review:</u> Roading engineers and RSM to meet with Steve James regarding speed reduction in top 10% high benefit opportunities</li> <li>- <u>Speed slowing signs</u> are to be installed on SH2 at the N &amp; S entrances to Featherston &amp; Greytown</li> <li>- WRSC is in the process of purchasing a 2nd car for the <u>CDMP youth driver programme.</u> Southey Honda will continue to loan a third car. This will allow the original vehicle to be utilized full time at Kuranui College. <u>South Wairarapa has the biggest number of students coming out of school in Wairarapa with their learners licence.</u> Submissions for CDMP have gone to each council.</li> <li>- RYDA was a huge success with around 280 yr 12 students attending. Had one day rained off but had wins with 60 Taratahi Students and the Teen Parenting Students</li> <li>- Holly designed a campaign for <u>Lids on Kids.</u> A donation was made by the Warehouse of \$1,710.00 for the first quarter of fundraising</li> <li>- Still waiting on consultant's report for the Waingawa Road and Norman Avenue intersection improvement.</li> <li>- With guidance from Holly, the <u>SADD</u> students continuing to lead their own groups</li> <li>- WRSC attended the Patriots <u>Motorcycle Club National Rally</u> at Tauherenikau in March. <u>Safety</u> stall with ACC and with the support of Sargents M/Cycles from Carterton provided free m/cycle safety checks. Over 100 riders there.</li> <li>- 17 Schools signed up for <u>Movin March</u> activities</li> <li>- Greytown, Featherston &amp; Carterton Schools are planning their own <u>Bikes in Schools</u> tracks</li> <li>- Pedal ready training in 10 schools over first 2 terms this year. focus on smaller schools in Term 3</li> <li>- 3x successful child car seat restraints clinics have been held this year</li> <li>- Bruce is in the process of setting up Staying Safe and Carfit workshops for Seniors.</li> </ul>
