Ms Hughes, supported by Ms Hooper, spoke to the report and tabled an updated copy of the proposed bylaw (<u>Tabled Item 9.4 Final draft – Bylaw V1</u>) and noted that the enforcement date had been updated to 1 December 2025.

Cr Ellims noted that majority of submissions supported vehicle restrictions, not vehicle banning and queried the intent of the original bylaw, and sought changes to the proposed bylaw that would allow responsible members of the community retain access.

Noted that staff have engaged surveyors for paper road and work will be starting shortly.

Members debated expectations for the entirety of the work to be completed, 12 versus 24 months.

Members queried period for review vs expiry of the bylaw, seeking further explanation of the finite period. Ms Smith clarified that the word *review* allow officers to come back to the council table in the next two years if there are issues that cannot be addressed in the 24 month time period.

Members sought further clarification from officers on the timings and finite period for the bylaw and also asked for an update version of the map (purple outline showing the paper road area in question).

As there was further work to be done before Council could make a decision, Mayor Connelly asked for the paper left to lie on table until morning tea to address any amendments.

Ms Smith spoke to the amended version of the bylaw as presented to the Council: <u>Tabled Item</u> 9.4 Final draft – Bylaw V2 ADOPTED.

Differences noted in the following sections: 1) title commencement and revocation – hard lock in of 24 month period; in Purpose section 3 the map was removed as well as the reference to map. The definition of the ULR was also updated. Also noted if anything changes in relation to the survey of the road, officers week seek updates via Land Information (LINZ).

Members thanked Ms Smith and the team in providing the update to the bylaw.

Members further queried that if in two years the survey, fencing and stakeholders group decisions are completed and ran ahead of schedule, that there was the ability for the enforcement of the bylaw to be revoked. Ms Smith provided Council assurance that if everything was completed, there would be a short consultation process to revoke the bylaw earlier.

Members queried whether there was an easier way to revoke this bylaw without consultation. Ms Smith noted officers would have to discuss this with lawyers first.

Member highlighted that there had been considerable discussion held in deliberations relating to the period of 12 versus 24 months for the bylaw.

Members they were here to make decisions based on the unformed legal roads, noting that if a survey had been available, it would have been beneficial in making decisions on the bylaw.

Ms Smith confirmed that surveyors would on site to complete work relating to the paper road by end of the month.

Ms Smith noted any work along this road must to be done in conjunction with Heritage NZ and may have to engage with archaeologists - time would be needed to ensure that this work can be completed.

Members discussed access for vehicles to support others in emergencies, as well as individuals who have mobility issues.

Action 126 – Cr Maynard sought updates regarding Pain Farm. Ms Smith noted updates since June 2025, that the withdrawal of the designation through Wairarapa Combined District Plan process and negotiations of alternate land for wastewaster disposal were still ongoing. Action will remain open.

Action SWC2025/153 will also remain open.

All other actions closed.

11 MAYORAL REPORTS

11.1 MAYORAL REPORT - OCTOBER 2025

Mayor Connelly spoke to his report, acknowledging council officers for their work over the triennium, as well as highlighting issues regarding illegal rubbish dumping and exploration of what can be done about this. Councillors asked for further reporting to be submitted to the actions list for new Council to address.
