**10.2 MPC GRANT ALLOCATIONS - JUNE 2026****Author:** Lina McManus, Grants and Funding Advisor**Authoriser:** Janice Smith, Chief Executive Officer**File Number:** N/A**PURPOSE**

The purpose of this report is to provide the board with the grant applications received to the Māori Partnership Committee community grant fund for the June 2026 funding round.

**EXECUTIVE SUMMARY**

- The Māori Partnership Committee initially received four applications in the current funding round, which closed on 17 May 2026. Following discussions with the Chair of the Featherston Community Board (FCB), and in recognition of the oversubscription of funds (more than 25 applications requesting over \$80,000), Council officers sought guidance from the Chair of the Māori Partnership Committee (MPC). Approval was requested to include three additional applications from the FCB grant round that align with MPC Kaupapa and criteria.
- In addition, Pae Tū Mōkai o Tauira was invited to submit a single, more comprehensive application instead of two separate applications.
- An application from Papawai Marae, received after the deadline, was also accepted due to a bereavement.
- The committee has a total of 9 applications to review and \$27,063 to allocate to community groups and individuals in this funding round. The total amount subscribed for funding is \$29,017. The board is asked to consider the applications received and determine the best use of the funding available for allocation.
- Note – The applications included with this report are not conclusive of the details provided by the applicant. The committee has had an opportunity to review all supporting evidence, but for privacy reasons, some pages have not been included in the attached summary of applications included in this report's attachment.

**RECOMMENDATIONS**

Officers recommend that the Māori Partnership Committee:

2. Accept in full/accept in part/ the application from Hau Ariki Marae for \$3,707 to fund the essential infrastructure upgrades

4. Accept in full/accept in part/ the application from the South Wairarapa Working Men's Club for \$1,000 to fund a Matariki event at the Club
5. Accept in full/accept in part/ the application from Pae tū Mōkai o Taurira for \$1,456 to purchase a computer and printer, plus \$7,700 to deliver their school group environmental sessions
6. Accept in full/accept in part/ the application from Fareham for \$1,000 to fund their Community Blessing, Open Day and Matariki Hui
7. Accept in full/accept in part/ the application from Featherston Matariki Events Committee for \$1,500 to fund the Featherston Matariki Festival
8. Accept in full/accept in part/ the application from SMAC Gym for \$5,000 to fund the NZ Nationals Black Gloves team camp hosted in South Wairarapa
9. Accept in full/accept in part/ the application from Papawai Marae for \$4,300 to fund the purchase of bedding, basic kitchen cutlery and garden maintenance.

## BACKGROUND

South Wairarapa District Council is committed to promoting sustainable social, economic, cultural and environmental outcomes within the district. One way to achieve this is to provide community investment via grants to eligible community groups and projects benefiting the people of South Wairarapa.

The Māori Partnership Committee has delegated authority to make financial decisions within the allocated and available budget.

The committee operates its grant fund in accordance with the Council's Grants Policy. The Grants Policy applies to all grants funded by Council, including committees and community boards.

The committee is allocated funding for grants through the Long-Term Plan/Annual Plan. Grant allocations and any expenditure must be made by resolution at a formal meeting.

Under the current Grants Policy, eligibility for community board grants include:

- Community organisations, marae committees, school, an individual, or a group of individuals who have come together for a common purpose to benefit the South Wairarapa.
- Whilst the applicant does not need to be based in the South Wairarapa or the ward from where the funds are being sought, they should be able to demonstrate that the activity benefits the local community.

Under the current Grants Policy, the following allocation principles are applied:

- We are impartial and treat all applicants fairly.
- We operate transparently while protecting applicant's financial confidentiality
- We provide feedback to unsuccessful applicants so they can learn and know how to improve next time.
- We consider the outcomes of previous funding assistance given by Council.

## DISCUSSION

### OPTIONS

The options available to the committee are to fund, partially fund, or decline the applications as they are presented. If declining an application, the committee can request further information from the applicant and accept their application to a future funding round if appropriate, but should consider applicants time constraints.

### CONSIDERATIONS

The Māori Partnerships Committee was allocated like the community boards from the Council's Annual Plan process.

Therefore, the delegation for decision making is with the committee and has no further impact on the Council's AP/LTP, OPEX/CAPEX, rating impact or procurement process.

Applications should align with at least one of the committee's four pou – Tautoko, Te Taiao, Whakapapa and Marae Wawata.

## COMPLIANCE SCHEDULE

Full consideration has been given to the provisions of the Local Government Act 2002 S77 in relation to decision making, in particular:

1. A Local authority must, in the course of the decision-making process,
  - a) Seek to identify all reasonably practicable options for the achievement of the objective of a decision; and
  - b) Assess the options in terms of their advantages and disadvantages; and
  - c) If any of the options identified under paragraph (a) involves a significant decision in relation to land or a body of water, take into account the relationship of Māori and their culture and traditions with their ancestral land, water sites, waahi tapu, valued flora and fauna and other taonga.

Hau Ariki Marae is seeking funding to undertake essential maintenance and infrastructure upgrades to ensure the marae can safely and effectively continue to host whānau, hapori and manuhiri.

The primary priority is the urgent replacement of a failed califont that provides hot water to the marae's shower and ablution facilities. One of two existing califonts has reached the end of its serviceable life and is leaking beyond repair. This significantly impacts the marae's ability to accommodate overnight stays and large gatherings.

In addition, there are maintenance issues including repairing a kitchen sink tap and upgrading external flooring/decking outside the accommodation wing (not included in this application) to ensure safety and usability.

Hau Ariki Marae regularly hosts a wide range of activities including tangihanga, wānanga, school visits, community meetings, and cultural development. These upgrades are essential to maintaining a safe, hygienic and functional environment for all users.

The marae regularly hosts groups ranging from 10 to 100 people, with ongoing use throughout the year for overnight stays, events, and community activities. The project is aimed at:

- whānau and hapū connected to Hau Ariki Marae

- manuhiri attending tangihanga, hui and cultural events

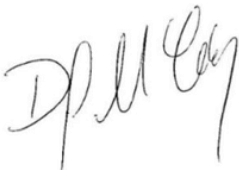

It builds directly on the foundations established last year with Lee Flutey, ensuring continuity of learning while also expanding our repertoire with new waiata and haka from across the wider Wairarapa. Through regular tutoring, students deepen their understanding of te reo Māori, tikanga, and the stories behind each item, strengthening their cultural identity, confidence, and connection to place. The programme supports both*

*the preservation of what has already been learned and the growth of new skills and knowledge within our kapa haka group.*

*This kapa haka tutor programme strongly aligns with the four pou of the Māori Partnership Committee. It contributes to Tautoko by providing structured support that enables tamariki and rangatahi to access high-quality cultural learning and to develop their skills and confidence in kapa haka. It reflects Te Taiao through strengthening our connection to the natural and spiritual world, expressed through waiata, karakia, haka, waiata ā-ringa and mau rākau, all of which acknowledge and draw upon te taiao and our environment. Through the teaching and continuation of waiata, haka and local histories from across the wider Wairarapa, the programme upholds Whakapapa by deepening understanding of ancestral connections, local stories, and cultural identity. It also supports Marae Wawata by building capability within our school and wider community, enabling tauira to carry tikanga and te reo Māori forward and contribute to the wellbeing and aspirations of our marae and whānau.*

*This mahi is further strengthened by our ongoing connections with local marae. Last year, our kapa haka group experienced their first noho marae at Kohunui Marae, which was a significant and memorable experience for our rōpū. We were also privileged this year to take our senior students to Te Ore Ore Marae to learn about Paora Pōtangaroa and the history of the area. We are committed to continuing and strengthening our relationships with Kohunui Marae and Hau Ariki Marae, as these are the marae to which many of our tamariki have direct whakapapa connections.*

Pae Tū Mōkai o Tauria is an Incorporated Society giving Featherston a Māori voice. Toitū te whenua, toitū te moana, toitū te tangata: ‘Heal the land, heal the lake, heal the people’. Our Mission is to:

- provide a strong Māori voice committed to bringing mana to our lives and to the communities that we walk in.
- stand for the revitalisation and sustained kaitiakitanga of Wairarapa Moana and the surrounding natural environment (Te Taiao).
- enable cultural and environmental change through knowledge sharing (wānanga) and collaboration (whakawhanaungatanga).
- share and develop principles (Tikanga) and values (Kawa) that Te Ao Māori bring to our communities.

Society members have “made do” with their own computers until now. It’s time to buy a dedicated computer and printer. He Kōtare Native Nursery has a thriving plant sales business (earning over \$10,000 in the past year) which requires accurate stock levels and payment processing. There are all the usual administration jobs. Staff will use the computer for emails, document and spreadsheet preparation and website maintenance.

**Who is the project/event aimed at? Who is your target audience?**

Our target audience is Wairarapa Moana and her community. We estimate that our work through Te Whare Whakapapa Raranga and He Kōtare Native Nursery reaches 1,500 people.

Te Whare Whakapapa Raranga is an important gathering place for the Pae tū Mōkai o Tauria/Featherston community. The Hangi, Hikoī, Hakari hoki! event in April 2025 succeeded in bringing our community together.

He Kōtare Native Nursery grows native species to improve the poor water quality and mamae/unwellness of the Moana. Planting helps the habitat and will increase native fish and bird populations.

Volunteer weeding and planting events prove the benefit to Māori and non-Māori of Pae tū Mōkai o Tauria/Featherston. In December last year, for example, we supplied 700 at-risk karaihe (Carex buchananii) for the Western Lake Reserve. About fifty volunteers planted them along the foreshore.

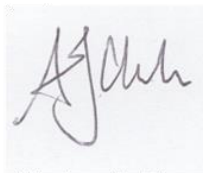

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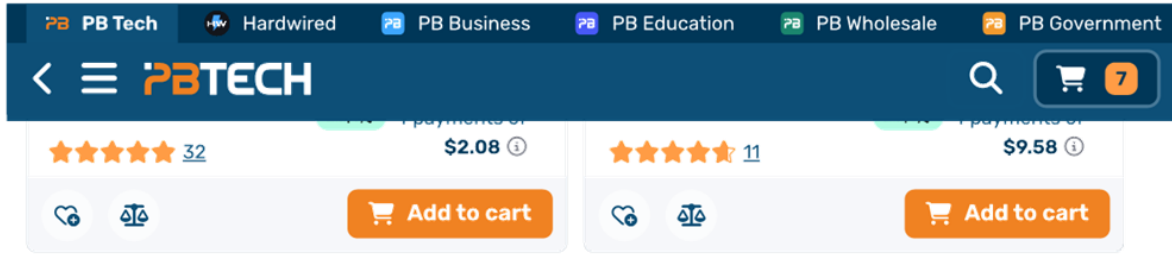

School Group Environmental Sessions

When and where is your project/event taking place?

September 2026 at Wairarapa Moana with Kahutara Primary and Martinborough schools

June 2026 – Autumn 2027 at Donald's Creek and He Kōtare Nursery with Saint Teresa's School, Featherston

**Tell us a bit about your project/event and what it entails?**

Pae tū Mōkai o Tairā/Featherston is near the largest wetland in the lower North Island but the area is threatened. We need to raise awareness of the plight of this taonga through education and get our young people interested.

We will run different activities with tamariki to get them comfortable in and engaged with the natural environment. We are partnering with Jane Riddiford of the Ruamāhanga Farm Foundation and with St Teresa’s Featherston, our pilot school. EnviroSchools is helping us design a sustainability project for children.

Activities will include planting at both Wairarapa Moana and Donald’s Creek and making driftwood sculptures. We will teach the cycle of the seasons by planting in winter, seed sowing at the Nursery in spring, then summer plant maintenance, and propagation and seed collecting in autumn.

After the pilot sessions, we can adjust the programme before rolling it out to other South Wairarapa schools.

**Who is the project/event aimed at? Who is your target audience?**

Tamariki at Kahutara Primary and Martinborough schools  
 Tamariki at St Teresa’s School, Featherston

One of our successful cases of youth education was “Life in the Shallows”, a workshop for Years 8 to 11 at Booktown Karukatea in 2023. Other family events include planting days at the Moana and tours of He Kōtare Native Nursery with hands-on experience of plant propagation. This new School Group project carries on that mahi with younger children.

**How many people/volunteers are involved in organising this project/event?** 10

**How many people are you expecting to attend this project/event?** 100

**Please outline how your project/event will contribute to social, cultural, environmental or economic outcomes for our people and places?**

On planting days we have visible support from adults for our work to protect and restore Wairarapa Moana. This new project will draw in the children of our community. Our one-off sessions will get tamariki to the lakeside, while the repeat, seasonal sessions hope to inspire them to see themselves as part of the environment. In their lifetimes they will be able to restore the habitat and watch native species thrive.

**How are you planning on measuring the success of your project/event?**

We will get feedback from teachers. They are the best judges of the benefit to and involvement of the students. For the one-off events, would they recommend a repeat next year? For the seasonal sessions, how many tamariki are keen to come again?

We expect some great reactions from tamariki on the day which we will capture as quotations or a Word Cloud.

We need to cover the costs of plants themselves and the protectors, stakes and mats to give the natives the best chance of survival.

Most of the grant is for payment of our nursery staff. They will spend significant time before each session preparing plants and visiting sites to make sure that the day will be productive. They will discuss with teachers how to run the event to best effect and safely.

Our staff will lead each session, responding to the students’ curiosity and the weather on the day. Afterwards they will write up the project for the kura and as a resource to encourage other schools to join next season.

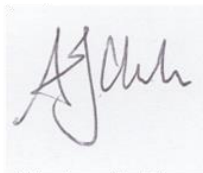

Fareham House is a historically and socially significant community space within Paetūmokai Featherston that is currently undergoing a community-led reset and reimagining process.

This application seeks support for two linked community events that acknowledge the past while dedicating the site toward a renewed future of service, connection and wellbeing for the local community.

The kaupapa is grounded in Ka mua, ka muri — walking backwards into the future.

### Featherston Matariki 2026

In July of 2026, the town of Featherston (Paetumokai) will acknowledge and celebrate our official national holiday of Matariki along with the rest of Aotearoa. This will be the 7th consecutive year that Featherston will have celebrated the revitalisation of this ancient temporal marker of the lunar calendar (Maramataka). These celebrations have provided the wider community an opportunity to connect with Te Ao Māori perspectives to celebrate our diverse, multi-cultural town.

Event objectives include wide community engagement, mātauranga Māori knowledge sharing through story-telling, kapahaka and fun for all residents and participants living in Featherston and South Wairarapa. Children have been introduced to Manu tukutuku (kite) making, local Pūrakau have been shared by Mana Whenua, Taonga Pūoro concerts, stalls, music, artworks and many other activities have been embraced by our small Wairarapa township. With a growing acknowledgement of Te Ao Māori and mātauranga Māori (Māori knowledge and epistemologies), the Featherston Matariki Events Group (FMEG) are looking to expand on what has already been established to make our Featherston Matariki Event a time of tūhonotanga (connection) to both celebrate mātauranga Māori and develop stronger cultural awareness within our community.

### Who is the Featherston Matariki Events Group?

The Featherston Matariki Events Group (FMEG) are a group of Featherston residents, Kaupapa Māori Committee members, Teachers, Wairarapa Gateway business owners, Featherston Booktown members, School Principals, Library, local clubs, parents and FCB representatives who want to see Featherston flourish culturally and economically as a growing provincial town in the beautiful Wairarapa.

The group formed in 2019 as a response to the growing interest in Matariki as a time for reflection and celebration. While other Wairarapa towns explore a more *consumer* driven path of 'Mid-winter Xmas' potentials, FMEG took a more relevant Cultural direction and started to celebrate Matariki instead; resulting in positive community feedback and mana enhancing connections.

The core FMEG committee is largely made of a range of community members who, as previously stated, are passionately supportive of this Matariki kaupapa and who want to see Featherston flourish and be culturally enriched.

### Who is the project/event aimed at? Who is your target audience?

Our Matariki Event has a localised focus that celebrates residents of Featherston town and the wider rural community. Last year we also had events that included Pirinoa and School. Our main event is the shared hangi where anyone is welcome to come to the ANZAC hall and sit down to share a meal together. We usually have around 300 – 400 people join us; either at the Hangi, Hautapu, Star Hunt or cemetery event where we remember our loved ones passed.

This annual Festival celebrates the rich social, cultural, environmental and educational aspects of our community. Through knowledge sharing we develop understanding of other cultural perspectives, including taiao (environmental) considerations. Through shared kai we weave a stronger social cohesion within communities. Through shared experiences we grow and inspire manaakitanga. Because this is a community event, there isn't the desire for fiscal profiteering. However, the event does draw public engagement which has a positive fiscal 'osmosis' effect on local businesses.

**How are you planning on measuring the success of your project/event?**

The success of this event is measured by verbal and visual feedback we get from our patrons and whanau. This year we will be including a community survey and suggestions form as an activity for whanau who attend the hangi. Planning for the year ahead is a big part of Matariki, so we are also looking to include a community exercise around Emergency Responsiveness. As a teacher at Kuranui high school, I see long term community and social benefits with Matariki now being normalised as a part of the yearly calendar and students understand what the occasion is about.

We have \$944 in our bank account. This has mostly been donations given to us from people after our hangi. Surplus from each event goes towards building the festival for the following year e.g. procuring more materials for kids art activities, glow artworks for the night trains etc.

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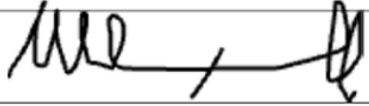
