


**OFF-LICENCE**

Sections 17 to 20 and Section 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 **Shiv 25 Limited** is authorised to sell or deliver alcohol on or from the premises situated at **43 Fitzherbert Street, Featherston**, and known as **Featherston Supervalu**, to any person for consumption off the premises and to supply complimentary samples of alcohol on the premises.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

**CONDITIONS OF LICENCE**

- (a) Alcohol may be sold on, or delivered from the premises for consumption off the premises, or supplied free as a sample for consumption on the premises, only on the following days and hours:  
**Monday to Sunday 7:00 am to 9:00 pm**
- (b) No alcohol is to be sold on, or delivered from, the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday or Christmas Day or before 1:00 pm on ANZAC Day.
- (c) No alcohol is to be sold other than:
- i. Beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer; or
  - ii. Mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
  - iii. Fruit or vegetable wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for fruit or vegetable wine (however that product may be described in the standard); or
  - iv. Grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine (however that product may be described in the standard); or
  - v. A food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.  
*Appropriate New Zealand food standard, in relation to any kind of alcohol, means the standard for alcohol of that kind that is for the time being in force under the Food Act 2014.*
- (d) The following steps must be taken to ensure that compulsory conditions of Sections 112, 113, and 114 of the Act relating to the display and promotion of alcohol in a single area in the premises are observed:
- i. alcohol must only be sold and supplied on the premises in accordance with the single area plan submitted with the application.
  - ii. the only area delineated on the attached plan described in shading, is the permitted single area for the display and promotion of alcohol.
  - iii. the identified single area must not be reconfigured or rearranged unless a variation/change to the single area is applied for.
  - iv. No display or promotion of, or advertisement for, a product of alcohol shall occur outside of the described single area of the premises.
  - v. No display or promotion of, advertisement for, a product that is not alcohol shall occur inside the described alcohol single area of the premises.
- (e) Drinking water is to be freely available to customers while alcohol is being supplied free as a sample, from the location at which the sampling occurs.
- (f) A properly appointed certified manager must be on duty at all times, within the licensed area, when the premises are open for the sale and supply of alcohol and their full name must be on a sign prominently displayed in the premises.
- (g) The designation of the premises is defined as: **undesigned**
- (h) The licensee must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display:
- i. At each principal entrance to the premises, the ordinary operating hours during which the sale of alcohol is permitted.
  - ii. A copy of the licence and all conditions subject to which it is issued, to the inside of the premises so to be easily read by all people entering at each principal entrance.
  - iii. At every point of sale for alcohol, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.

**Remote Sales**

- (i) A remote sale of alcohol may be made at any time on any day
- (j) No alcohol is to be delivered from the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1:00 pm on ANZAC Day.
- (k) The licensee must ensure that any alcohol sold by remote sale is not delivered to the buyer (or to any other person on the buyer's behalf) at any time after 11:00 pm on any day or before 6:00 am on the next day. Whether the alcohol is delivered by the seller or by some other person.
- (l) The licensee must follow the procedures set out in Regulations 14 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Regulation 2013 to ensure that neither the purchaser nor the person to whom alcohol is delivered to is a minor.
- (m) The licensee must display on its website and/or catalogues and on every receipt issued for alcohol sold remotely:
  - i. The licence holder's name and licence number;
  - ii. The date on which the licence expires;

A legible image of the licence or a clearly identified link to such an image

**THE LICENSED PREMISES**

The premises, situated at **43 Fitzherbert Street, Featherston** are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date received by the **South Wairarapa District Licensing Committee** on the **20/07/23**.

**DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S**


A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from **43 Fitzherbert Street, Featherston** is designated as the principal entrance.

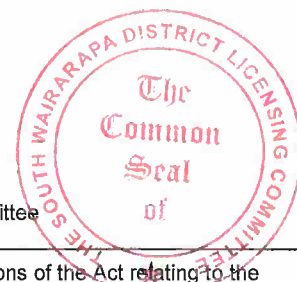
**DURATION**

- (c) If the licence is renewed, until the close of the period for which it is renewed.

**DECISION**

This is an application **Shiv 25 Limited** for a renewal off-licence in respect of premises situated at **43 Fitzherbert Street, Featherston**, known as **Featherston Supervalu**.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly, we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act and we grant the applicant a renewal off-licence authorising the sale and supply of liquor for consumption off the premises with the following conditions (a)-(m).

- (a) Alcohol may be sold on, or delivered from the premises for consumption off the premises, or supplied free as a sample for consumption on the premises, only on the following days and hours:

**Monday to Sunday 7:00 am to 9:00 pm**

- (b) No alcohol is to be sold on, or delivered from, the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday or Christmas Day or before 1:00 pm on ANZAC Day.

- (c) No alcohol is to be sold other than:

- i. Beer that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for beer;  
or
- ii. Mead that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for mead; or
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- iv. Grape wine that complies with the appropriate New Zealand food standard for grape wine (however that product may be described in the standard); or
- v. A food flavouring, prepared for culinary purposes, that is unsuitable for drinking undiluted.
