DECISION

This is an application by **Margrain Vineyard Limited** for a renewal on-licence in respect of premises situated at **5 Huangarua Road, Martinborough**, known as "**The Vineyard Café**"

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act and we grant the applicant a renewal on-licence authorising the sale and supply of liquor for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises.

The licence may issue with the following conditions:

1. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
2. Alcohol may be sold and supplied on the premises on such days and during such hours as the premises are being operated as a Café but not other than on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 9.00am to 1.00am the following day
3. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers while the premises are open for business.
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages.
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: **At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.**
6. The licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
7. The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
8. The licences must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

ON-LICENCE

(for premises)

Sections 14 to 16 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (The Act), **Margrain Vineyard Limited** is authorised to sell and supply liquor on the premises situated at **5 Huangarua Road, Martinborough** and known as **The Vineyard Cafe**, to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with with subpart 7 of part 2 of the Act.

CONDITIONS

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
2. Alcohol may be sold and supplied on the premises on such days and during such hours as the premises are being operated as a Café but not other than on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 9.00am to 1.00am the following day
3. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers while the premises are open for business.
4. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages.

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The premises, situated at **5 Huangarua Road, Martinborough**, are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the South Wairarapa District Licensing Committee on **30 September 2014**

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from **5 Huangarua Road, Martinborough** is designated as the principal entrance.

DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provision of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force –

(a) Either –

- i. Until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
- ii. If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but

(b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either –

- i. Until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or

If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.
