ON-LICENCE

Sections 14-16 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (The Act), **THE QUIET MAN LIMITED** is authorised to sell and supply liquor on the premises situated at **33 Main Street, Greytown, 5712** known as "**THE GREYTOWN HOTEL**", to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with section 212 of subpart 7 of the Act.

The licence is subject to the following conditions

1. No alcohol is not to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not-
 - I. Residing or lodging on the premises; or
 - II. Present on the premises to dine
2. Alcohol may be sold and supplied on the premises on the following days and during the following hours: Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 1.00am the following day; EXCEPT that on the Thursday before Good Friday; on Easter Saturday, Christmas Eve, and the day before Anzac Day, alcohol may only be sold between 7.00am to 12.00 midnight.
3. The following parts of the premises is designated as a **supervised area: Every Bar**
4. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers while the premises are open for business at the following place or places: **Bar and dining tables.**
5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages.
6. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: **At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.**
7. The licensee must provide information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
8. The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol. The host responsibility policy must be displayed in view of the public.
9. The licences must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons

THE LICENSED PREMISES

The premises, situated at **33 Main Street, Greytown** are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan date stamped as received by the South Wairarapa District Licensing Committee on **11th May 2016**.

DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S

A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from **33 Main Street, Greytown, 5712** is designated as the principal entrance.


DURATION

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provision of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force –

- (a) Either –
 - i. Until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
 - ii. If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either –
 - i. Until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or

If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.

DECISION

This is an application by **The Quiet Man Limited** for a renewal on-licence in respect of premises situated at **33 Main Street, Greytown** known as "**The Greytown Hotel**"

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

I am satisfied as to the matters to which I must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act and I grant the applicant a renewal on-licence authorising the sale and supply of liquor for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises.

CONDITIONS OF LICENCE:

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. No alcohol is not to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not-
 - I. Residing or lodging on the premises; or
 - II. Present on the premises to dine
2. Alcohol may be sold and supplied on the premises on the following days and during the following hours:
Monday to Sunday 7.00am to 1.00am the following day; EXCEPT that on the Thursday before Good Friday; on Easter Saturday, Christmas Eve, and the day before Anzac Day, alcohol may only be sold between 7.00am to 12.00 midnight.
3. The following parts of the premises is designated as a supervised area: **Every Bar**
4. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers while the premises are open for business at the following place or places: Bar and dining tables.
5. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises are open for the sale of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol beverages.
6. Food must be available for consumption on the premises as follows: At all times when the premises are authorised to be open for the sale of alcohol, a range of food choices must be readily available. Menus must be visible and food should be actively promoted.

7. The licensee must provide information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
8. The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol. The host responsibility policy must be displayed in view of the public.
9. The licences must ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons

The applicant's attention is drawn to ss. 56, 57 and 214 (3) of the Act obliging the holder of an on-licence to display:-

1. At each principal entrance to the premises a sign attached to the inside or outside of the premises, so as to be easily read by people immediately outside the entrance, stating the ordinary hours of business during which the premises will be open for the sale of alcohol; AND
2. A copy of the licence, and of the conditions of the licence, attached to the interior of the premises so as to be easily read by persons entering through each principal entrance; AND
3. A sign prominently displayed inside the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
