**DECISION**

This is an application by **Brac and Bow Partnership** for a renewal on-licence in respect of premises situated **29 Fitzherbert Street, Featherston** known as "**Brac and Bow**"

The general nature of the business conducted under the licence is a **restaurant**.

The application was duly advertised and no objection or notice of desire to be heard has been received. Accordingly we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s.131 of the Act and we grant the applicant a renewal on-licence authorising the sale and supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises, to any person who is present on the premises.


**CONDITIONS:**

1. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
2. Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:  
Monday to Sunday, 8.00 am to 1.00 am the following day.
3. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers at all times while the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
4. Food must be available for consumption at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol. The range must be in accordance with the menu submitted with this application or of a similar range and standard. Food must be actively promoted and available within a reasonable time of ordering.
5. A reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages must be available for consumption at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
6. A properly appointed certified manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol and their name must be prominently displayed.
7. Information, advice and assistance about alternative transport options must be freely given to guests on the licensed premise.
8. The responsible consumption of alcohol is to be promoted at all times by instigating and maintaining the steps outlined in the application for the licence and displaying the host responsibility policy at all times.
9. The licensee must display:
  - a. At each principal entrance to the premises, the ordinary operating hours during which the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
  - b. A copy of the licence and all conditions subject to which it is issued, to the inside of the premises so to be easily read by all people entering at each principal entrance.
  - c. At every point of sale for alcohol, signs detailing restrictions on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons.
10. The licensee is only to operate as a class 3 restaurant.

**REASON FOR DECISION**

Having regard for the information supporting the application and the relevant statutory criteria under s. 127 of the Sale & supply of Alcohol Act 2012 the DLC therefore accordingly grants the renewal of the On Licence subject to the above conditions.

**ON-LICENCE**  
(for premises)

Sections 14 to 16 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

PURSUANT to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (The Act), **Brac and Bow Partnership** is authorised to sell and supply liquor on the premises situated at **29 Fitzherbert Street, Featherston** and known as "**Brac and Bow**", to any person for consumption on the premises and to let people consume alcohol there.

The general nature of the business conducted under the licence is a **restaurant**

The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with with subpart 7 of part 2 of the Act.

**CONDITIONS**

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. No alcohol is to be sold on the premises on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day, or before 1pm on Anzac Day to any person who is not present on the premises to dine.
2. Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours:  
Monday to Sunday, 8.00 am to 1.00 am the following day.
3. Drinking water is to be freely available to customers at all times while the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
4. Food must be available for consumption at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol. The range must be in accordance with the menu submitted with this application or of a similar range and standard. Food must be actively promoted and available within a reasonable time of ordering.
5. A reasonable range of non-alcoholic and low-alcohol beverages must be available for consumption at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
6. A properly appointed certified manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol and their name must be prominently displayed.
7. Information, advice and assistance about alternative transport options must be freely given to guests on the licensed premise.

10. The licensee is only to operate as a class 3 restaurant.

**THE LICENSED PREMISES**

The premises, situated at **29 Fitzherbert Street, Featherston**, are more precisely identified as outlined in a plan received by the South Wairarapa District Licensing Committee

**DISPLAY OF LICENCE AND PRINCIPAL ENTRANCE/S**


A copy of this licence must be displayed at the principal entrance to the premises. The entrance from **29 Fitzherbert Street, Featherston** is designated as the principal entrance.

**DURATION**

Subject to the requirements of the Act relating to the payment of fees, and to the provision of the Act relating to the suspension and cancellation of licences, this licence continues in force –

- (a) Either –
  - i. Until the close of the period for which it was last renewed; or
  - ii. If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 12 months after the day it was issued; but
- (b) If an application for the renewal of the licence is duly made before the licence would otherwise expire, either –
  - i. Until the close of the period of 3 years after the period for which it was last renewed; or
  - ii. If it has never been renewed, until the close of the period of 4 years after the day it was issued.
