Official information Request: Rating Review - Rural Rates (breakdown)

I am writing to you in response to your request received 9 October 2023 for information relating to the Rating Review:

I support the Federated Farmers' submission regarding a full rates review for rural landholders. As rural families we are disproportionately charged rates verses the urban population of the South Wairarapa.

We get very little in return for our increasing rates bill and this is crippling farmers and their families. If we are expected to pay the current charges and the forever increasing rates we should have functioning roads as a minimum. Infrastructure that supports the rural businesses and the families that run them should be the absolute minimum we can expect. I would like to see a breakdown of exactly what our rural rates are spent on.

We have assessed your request under the Local Government Official Information and Meetings Act 1987 (LGOIMA). I have received information to provide the following response:

It is noted that Federated Farmers commended the SWDC conducting a rating model review in their 2023/24 Annual Plan submission. We have not yet received a submission from Federated Farmers, but will add your comments to theirs when we do.

The breakdown of what activities are funded from the general rates (UAGC and General Rate) versus targeted rates and/or other income sources can be seen in Appendix One of the Statement of Proposal, the Funding Needs Analysis, along with Council's rationale for the split of where each activity is funded from. Activities deemed to have a benefit to the whole district are funded from general rates on all rateable properties. Activities deemed to have benefit to part of the district are funded from fees, charges, and targeted rates.
