

Special Licence

Sections 22 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **COBBLESTONES TRUST** is authorised to sell and supply alcohol, on the premises situated at **169 Main Street Greytown**, and known as **Cobblestones Museum** to any person attending the following occasion or event (or series of occasions or events):

Cobblestones Museum Country Fairs

(Except where the District Licensing Committee grants an exemption under section 213(2) of the Act) The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

Conditions

This licence is subject to the following conditions:

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:
Saturday 13 July 2024 between 11:00am and 3:00pm
Saturday 20 July 2024 between 11:00am and 3:00pm
2. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
3. Drinking water is to be freely available at all times.
4. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
6. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. At every point-of-sale detailing restriction on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons; and
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
7. The events are to be designated: **undesignated**
8. The licensee must ensure compliance with the provisions of the Act regarding sale to prohibited persons.
 - (i) Intoxicated persons and minors are not to be served or supplied alcohol
 - (ii) If a person's age is in doubt one of the approved forms of "evidence of age" documents must be requested.

Duration This licence is in force on **13 July 2024 from 11:00am to 3:00pm** and **20 July 2024 from 11:00am to 3:00pm**

DECISION DETERMINED ON THE PAPERS

This is an application for a Special Licence under section 22 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. The application is for **Cobblestones Museum Country Fairs** to be held at **169 Main Street Greytown**, and known as **Cobblestones Museum**, where alcohol will be consumed on the premises.

The application was sent to the Police, Inspector and Medical Officer of Health under s. 141 and no reports of opposition were received. The application was not required to be publicly notified.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s. 3, s. 4 and s.142 and s.143 of the Act. We grant the applicant a special licence in terms of s.22 subject to the restrictions imposed by s.147 with the following conditions 1-8.

1. Alcohol may be sold or supplied for consumption on the premises only on the following days and hours:

Saturday 13 July 2024 between 11:00am and 3:00pm

Saturday 20 July 2024 between 11:00am and 3:00pm

2. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when alcohol may be sold under the licence, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments.
3. Drinking water is to be freely available at all times.
4. A certificated manager must be on duty at all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.

6. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. At every point-of-sale detailing restriction on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons; and
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
7. The events are to be designated: **undesignated**
8. The licensee must ensure compliance with the provisions of the Act regarding sale to prohibited persons.
 - a. Intoxicated persons and minors are not to be served or supplied alcohol, and
 - b. If a person's age is in doubt one of the approved forms of "evidence of age" documents must be requested.
