

Special Licence

Sections 22 and 64, Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012

Pursuant to the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012, **FEATHERSTON BOOKTOWN TRUST** is authorised to sell and supply alcohol, on the premises situated at **60-64 Bell Street, Featherston** and known as **ANZAC Hall and Kiwi Hall** to any person attending the following occasion or event (or series of occasions or events):

Featherston Booktown Karukatea Festival 2026

(Except where the District Licensing Committee grants an exemption under section 213(2) of the Act) The authority conferred by this licence must be exercised through a manager or managers appointed by the licensee in accordance with Subpart 7 of Part 2 of the Act.

Conditions

1. Alcohol may be sold, supplied, and consumed on the premises only on the following day and hours:
Friday 8 May 2026 – 6:00pm to 9:00pm
Saturday 9 May 2026 – 6:00pm to 9:30pm
Sunday 10 May 2026 – 3:30pm to 5:00pm
2. The event is to be designated as: **undesignated**
3. A certified manager must be on duty at all times, at each bar, when the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol.
4. Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises.
5. Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol, in accordance with the sample menu supplied with the application for this licence, or menu variations of a similar range and standard.
6. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises is open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic beverages.
7. The Licensee must display signage as follows:
 - a. At every point of supply detailing restriction on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons; and
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
8. The licensee must ensure compliance with the provisions of the Act regarding sale to prohibited persons.
 - (a) Intoxicated persons and minors are not to be served or supplied alcohol
 - (b) If a person's age is in doubt one of the approved forms of "evidence of age" documents must be requested.

DECISION DETERMINED ON THE PAPERS

This is an application for a Special Licence under section 22 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012. The application is for **Featherston Booktown Karukatea Festival 2026** to be held at **60-64 Bell Street, Featherston** and known as **Featherston Booktown Trust**, where alcohol will be consumed on the premises.

The application was sent to the Police, Inspector and Medical Officer of Health under s. 141 and no reports of opposition were received. The application was not required to be publicly notified.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard as set out in s. 3, s. 4 and s.142 and s.143 of the Act. We grant the applicant a special licence in terms of s.22 subject to the restrictions imposed by s.147.

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6. The licensee must have available for consumption on the premises, at all times when the premises is open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic beverages.
7. The Licensee must display signage as follows:

- a. At every point of supply detailing restriction on the sale and supply of alcohol to minors and intoxicated persons; and
 - b. A copy of the licence attached to the premises so as to be easily read by persons attending the premises; and
 - c. A sign prominently displayed at the premises, which identifies by name the manager for the time being on duty.
8. The licensee must ensure compliance with the provisions of the Act regarding sale to prohibited persons.
- (a) Intoxicated persons and minors are not to be served or supplied alcohol
 - (b) If a person's age is in doubt one of the approved forms of "evidence of age" documents must be requested.
