G: This is a HUGE one. The chemist carpark is a death trap and we are lucky to not have lost many there. It is axiomatic that a connection be made for pedestrians to walk the 50m between the doctor and the pharmacy. I realise this may require purchase of a corner of Dale and Caroline's carpark there; this is easily worth the health and safety benefits of not forcing unwell residents to drive around the block to the pharmacy and its deathtrap carpark. This one is IMHO huge low-hanging fruit to be attacked with vigor and vim.

B: This is where the only public water fountain on this whole map is, in the 'squircle'. To facilitate better sports and better transport, there really needs to be a drinking fountain at the bottom (south east) corner of Card Reserve there for both athletes and commuters to access (kind of where the campervan tap is located opposite the dog park).

Really, the solution is to close off Fox Street where the toilets/Waimarie is, so that it's a little cul-de-sac for long-distance buses to pull into and go to the toilet. This makes it much easier for parents to cross from Fox Street onto the triangle traffic island, and then again over to SH2. I understand the fire department have concerns about this, but these can be easily mitigated too by either (1) moving the firestation onto the main street into the rubble of Broeren's Ruins seized by eminent domain; or (2) creating a tunnel out the back of the existing fire station over the infamous easement on the "lemon land", so that all fire engines will exit straight onto SH2 for maximum speed and efficiency (thus freeing up Fox Street/Birdwood intersection for humanist and people-centric designs, such as closing off Fox Street to create a small cul-de-sac / pedestrian mall there).

The challenges and opportunities are mostly identified really well. Thank you.

One thing that is missing is the importance of Featherston as the first place in the Wairarapa that anyone travelling from the south on SH2, or anyone travelling north by train on the Wairarapa Line, comes to.

It is the Southern Gateway to welcome people to the Wairarapa valley.

This is important to the whole district and should form part of the focus in the Masterplan for the look and feel of the town and the decisions around development.

This would probably fit well in point (d):

Recognising the geographic location of the town *as the welcome / entry point to the Wairarapa Valley*, separated from Wellington by the Remutaka Ranges but with the benefit of the connectivity provided by the train station

Do you have any comments?:

100% support rezoning this area to mixed commercial / residential. It is vital that the existing heritage precincts should also be reviewed - both for location and conditions / requirements to ensure that the two work together and don't negatively impact development opportunities. To be honest, I'm not sure if the current heritage precinct is justified. The library and old courthouse are heritage buildings. The old BNZ bank building could possibly be considered as heritage. The building with the "Where the Wild Things Are" images on it, has a heritage plaque on it and PERHAPS, someone with a big heart and deep pockets could salvage the facade and build a fit for purpose building behind it. Then there is the War Memorial / Cenotaph. The rest of the buildings are not heritage buildings. The above mentioned structures are interspersed with other developments of varying styles and ages. The area doesn't LOOK like it is, or should be, a heritage zone, yet the restrictions currently in place because it is designated a heritage precinct have hindered even basic development of properties in that area.

Question 9: Do you have any feedback on the suggested key features in the town centre and train station in 11.9?

a. Concentrate 'town centre' uses into a more compact area

I'm assuming this refers to the rezoning of land south of Wakefield St / Bethune St to residential? If so, great.

b. Better link the existing open spaces

Sounds great - though we have too many open spaces and other things creating a disjointed main street (some we can't do anything about, like the railway line, and sadly also the derelict buildings).

One open space that we CAN do something about is Cherry Tree Park. This area could be rezoned to commercial or mixed commercial / residential. This would help to alleviate some of the disjointedness of the retail / commercial areas on our main street. If the land was leased out by the council then it could provide ongoing income to subsidise rates.

Another potential space is the wider end of the small triangle of land that contains the wind sculpture. With the proposed mixed use nature of the streets on two sides of it, this area could also be made available for lease and development. SWDC could even provide a container shop or something similar for lease.

A small business (hot & cold drinks & icecream? Bike rental?) could then utilise the space and the lease could provide ongoing income to SWDC.

The space could also be utilised as a dedicated information point containing maps of the town, and town centre and information about businesses and amenities and the surrounding area. It would require a structure to shelter it from the sun, wind and rain

Speaking of information points, it really is unacceptable that Featherston, as the southern gateway to the Wairarapa, doesn't have an isite or similar. This could be addressed by having one or more digitised information points with a touch screen (perhaps linking to FeatherstonInfo.nz) in the town centre.

Utilising this space would also help connect the disjointed areas of our main street.

c. Create Welcome features (x4)

Do you mean Welcome to Featherston's Town Centre features? As opposed to the Welcome to Featherston features that resulted from the work of the Featherston Beautification Group that still haven't been re-installed? If so, sounds good. I support anything positive to draw attention to our town centre and make it an attractive place to stop.

I am curious about the four locations though. I can picture one each at the west and east end of the town centre (hopefully double-sided with one side saying welcome / haere mai and the other side something like see you again / haere ra) Perhaps one when entering / leaving the town centre on the new train station route. Not sure about the fourth one?

d. Street Improvements to allow easier crossing and increase amenity of environment

Definitely agree with additional pedestrian crossings at east and west end of the town centre (Wakefield / Bethune to Hickson / Wallace Sts) and making all of the crossings raised crossings.

Vehemently opposed to losing ANY car parks in this area and to any measures that make it difficult, or impossible, for driver's of longer vehicles (trucks, trucks with trailers, camper vans, cars towing trailers or caravans) to pull over and park.

Being a business owner in Featherston for over a decade I can tell you that a good proportion of business in Featherston comes from people who were intending to pass though but chose to pull over and stop BECAUSE it was easy to do so.

Perhaps this will change some time in the future if Featherston becomes a destination in and of itself, but that will never happen if we

kill off current businesses by removing convenient access.

e. Upgrades to improve appearance of entry to town centre Make that "entries" and, yes. 100%

f. Create a shared multifunction space

This idea has been mooted a few times in the past and it's current iteration (pedestrian friendly while still providing parking for the businesses and ease of closure for events) definitely has merit.

I do have reservations about calling it the Booktown Precinct - even though it could potentially benefit my own business (opposite the War memorial on the other side of Fitzherbert Street).

Only three of the seven currently designated Featherston Booktown Bookshops are located in this area. One is just outside this area (by the playground), two are close to the supermarket and one is close to the west end of the planned town centre area.

If the plans (hopes?) for the Featherston Booktown organistion to have a premises in the area goes ahead, then calling it the Booktown Precinct makes more sense.

- g. Look at options to improve pedestrian linkages from Fitzherbert Street to Community Centre and Medical Centre This should be a connectivity priority.
- i. Transform pedestrian and cycle linkage to Station/Sports Grounds and Swimming Pool Fabulous.
- j. Create additional on-street pedestrian and cycle route to Station and Sports Hub to supplement existing north section of linkage to Station

Ideally it would be an on-street cycle lane and separate footpath utilising the grassy berm. From what I can tell, it is possible to have them separate - which is safer. The cycle lane can be created on the road with paint.

k. Narrow Daniell Street carriageway and build dedicated pedestrian/cycle link.

I'm not sure about the need for / positive impact of narrowing the section of Daniell Street by the Supermarket and making it one way.

There should be enough space on the green space to create a cycle path and a footpath without narrowing the street.

Also, the plan includes creating parking on Fox Street. If that part of Daniell Street is made one way, direction south, then people can only access that parking on Fox Street by driving down to Birdwood street (or a little further to the SH2 junction with Fox Street).

Creating a parking circuit is, in and of itself, not a bad idea. Unfortunately, any parking zone created on Fox Street will increase traffic going through the Birdwood Street / Fox Street area adjacent to the playground, skate park and public toilets which, as included in the plan, it is important to increase the safety of.

This area is used, not only for the amenities adjacent it, but also by the local schools when accessing the library, the swimming pools and each other.

If the current plan has taken this into consideration, then great. If not, then perhaps some tweaking is needed?

I. Provide recreation opportunities for youth to increase use of area Not sure how this would be realised?

We definitely need more positive activities for the vouth. Not sure about the location if this is alongside to main access to the train



station. Sad to say it but pedestrians or cyclists could potentially feel uncomfortable or threatened if groups of youth hang out in the area.

m. Carry out maintenance of planting alongside existing pedestrian/cycle route and improve signage Perfect!

n, o & p Work with KiwiRail to confirm best options for upgrades and closures of crossings Good luck!

Any closures would be less than ideal for at least some locals.

The Fox St crossing closure will increase traffic to and from the train station going past St Teresa's School.

Unless the proposed changes to the area discourages it, it will likely also increase traffic going past the playground area as people who are used to using Fox St to get to the station continue to take Donald St, Fox St across SH2 and then turn into Birdwood St and then Bell St, rather than turning off Fox St into Hickson St.

q. Future pedestrian and cycle link

Definitely makes sense to link the Featherston - Woodside cycle trail to the town centre and beyond at some point in the plan.

Question 10: Do you support the proposed historic heritage precinct? (Subject to a detailed study into its values and boundaries which will likely restrict development within that area).

Do you have any comments about the proposed heritage precinct?:

Quote from the Masterplan Consultation Document: "Much of the existing town centre area is already identified as a heritage precinct, and so change within that area (even if it is rezoned mixed use as proposed) would have to respect its heritage values." To reiterate my comment from question 8, there are heritage buildings here and there, but most are already interspersed with later developments. There isn't really any area of Featherston that I know of where it feels like you've stepped back in time and needs to be preserved. (And we don't want to try to be another Greytown!) For the existing heritage precincts, and any proposed heritage areas, is it not possible to protect specific buildings and properties as Heritage properties rather than an entire area? That would, it seems to me, help protect heritage while still enabling development around it.

When selling the land next to the supermarket car park, I believe there were conditions. One was that the successful development proposal would be the one that had the best community outcome and that the development should be done within a certain period of time.

So far (as far as I remember) it has been nearly five years since the land has been sold, there has been no sign of any development and there has only been the continuing detriment (for about 15 years now) of a gravel pit in our town centre.

Can something please be done to ensure positive things happen on that site as soon as possible and that the community be informed, and kept informed.

2.

SWDC was also to put the money from the sale of the land aside for use in Featherston. Can this money be used to fulfill the promise for the Squircle - that the boardwalks be lined with container shops or similar* (again an opportunity for SWDC to provide these for lease to generate income) and that we get a gazebo to provide shelter in the grass circle at the centre of the Squircle.

(*In consideration of any development on the adjacent land, and until we know what is planned there, at least container shops or similar on the eastern boardwalk)

3.

Are there any regulations that would prevent the fence in front of the (sadly) decaying train carriage opposite the supermarket from being covered and made more attractive? (It used to look pretty cool, but doesn't any more). If it can be cladded with canvas or plywood and get a mural painted on it that would make a huge difference!

If there are no regulations to prevent it, can SWDC and the Community Board facilitate and expedite this?

4.

Though it goes without saying, I'm going to say it anyway - please keep looking for ANYTHING that can be done to encourage neglectful town centre property owners to improve the state of their properties, make them fit for purpose and encourage them to not be left empty.

Is it possible to apply a rates surcharge for empty buildings? Or a rates rebate for improvements? Work with the owners to find out what the obstacles are and determine if council can help enable change?

Can anything be included in the Combined District Plan review that can help deal with the problem?

Those are things that have probably already been thought of but as time goes by and government regulations change, and council regulations change, it may be worth looking at again.

Question 13: Do you support the changes which are proposed to the level crossings?

Do you have any comments?:

Closing any of the crossings will be less than ideal for at least some people. We have a significant number of level crossings (four very close together and one a little way out of town) and I can understand that KiwiRail wants to reduce that number. I think similar safety upgrades, with lights, barrier arms and fencing like on Fitzherbert St (minus the objectionable centre island outside the pharmacy carpark entrance!) should be sufficient.

It should obviously remain open to pedestrians and cyclists, but then, why not cars as well?

Page 7: Draft Concept Design (Section 14)

Q17

Question 15: Do you have any feedback on the suggested upgrades in 14.2?

a. Raised pedestrian crossing at west entry to Town Centre; to mark entry, slow vehicles and improve safety and pedestrian connectivity.

Long overdue!

- b. Kerb lines moved out to enclose areas currently used as parking; to visually narrow road, slow vehicle speeds. Only if this slows vehicles without creating any loss of parking space (see my comment for Question 9 d.)
- c. New tree planting where space allows; to improve the appearance of the Town Centre, and to visually narrow the road to slow vehicle speeds.

Only if this doesn't cause any loss of parking space (see my comment for Question 9 d.) or other hazards / future problems such as the following (which are already issues that need to be contended with to some degree or other):

- current and future the impact on visibility from plant growth,
- future impact of root systems on surrounding roads and footpaths
- impact of branches on overhead lines
- the impact of plant debris (e.g. dead leaves) on nearby drains and gutters and on being blown down the main road wind tunnel, and
- the cost of maintaining the plantings and dealing with the above impacts.
- d. New footpath along front of petrol station; to improve pedestrian safety. This will be great for people using the bus stop adjacent to the petrol station.
- e. New raised pedestrian crossing outside at east end of petrol filling station; to improve safety and pedestrian connectivity. Long overdue! And as, for d. above, will be great for people using the bus stop near the petrol station and Kia Ora Dairy.
- f. Provision for cyclists to cross added to existing pedestrian crossing outside of supermarket. If there is some reason why cyclists can't use the existing crossing, then yes.

Q18

Question 16: Do you have any feedback on the suggested upgrades in 14.3?

a. Daniell Street carriageway narrowed (one way south).

As per my response to Question 9 k and Question 16 c, below.

b. New 3m shared path to station; to provide safe route for pedestrians and cyclists.

Not sure whether "shared path" means that cyclists will be among pedestrians (bad idea), or whether it will be one path with a designated pedestrian side and a designated cycling side (great idea). This feedback applies to all instances where "shared path" is mentioned in the consultation document.

c. New multi-use public space and welcome feature at south end, to mark entry (and south end) of new improved route to station. Highlights the improved route and provides space which could be used for purposes such as an expansion of the market.

Highlighting the route to the train station is essential (also at other points on the main road - such as the in the vicinity of the war memorial and the public toilets).

Looking at the accompanying map in this part of the consultation document, I disagree with Daniell St being narrowed and public space being created there.

The area doesn't connect to the area currently used for the market - and debatably, the Squircle was built to be, and should be encouraged to be used as the space for markets (as long as there is some shelter from the prevailing northwesterly winds).

We also really don't need any more multi-use public space on or near our main street!

It would be much better if angled parking be created on Daniell St (potentially on both sides). This would alleviate the potential problems of vehicles looking for parking on Fox St creating increased traffic through the proposed "town heart" area.

There should also be a pedestrian/cycle crossing at the main street end, by the supermarket, to accommodate pedestrians and cyclists on Fitzherbert St (it can be a challenging crossing for pedestrians), as well as those using the path to and from the train station.

- d. New tree planting in Daniell Street; to improve appearance of street and to provide shade.
- Shelter from the prevailing northwesterly wind is more relevant than shelter from the sun, but again, planting should take into account its overall impact (as mentioned in Questions 9 d and 15 c) and enhance traffic flow (pedestrian and vehicles) and parking, not replace it.
- e. Opportunities for sculptures and art features.

Art and sculptures can enhance the surroundings but art can be anywhere. We don't need to create specific spaces for it.

f. Fox Street level crossing shown closed to traffic with new gated crossing for pedestrians and cyclists to improve safety and connectivity for pedestrians and cyclists. This will assist with reducing vehicle movements in Fox Street, supporting the proposed upgrades to the 'Town Heart'. However it will mean that commuters will have to use Hickson Street and Bell Street to drive to the Train Station, rather than Fox Street and Johnston Street.

Reducing traffic on Fox St in the proposed "town heart" area will be beneficial for the non-vehicle use of that area.

Whether it will be successful is yet to be determined (see my response to Question 17 below)

g. The shared path will be adaptable; for instance there will be the opportunity to cover it or to add a shelter alongside it in the future, to



allow users to shelter from the sunshine or rain.

Lol. You forgot WIND again! This IS Featherston we're planning for. Wind really does need to be factored into any plans.

A sheltered walkway from the train station to the town centre would be fantastic!

Q19

Question 17: How do you feel about traffic having to use Hickson Street and Bell Street to drive to the Train Station, rather than Fox Street and Johnston Street?

As mentioned in my response to Question 9 n,o,p, unless the proposed changes to the area discourages it sufficiently, I expect that people who are used to using Fox St to get to the station will continue to take Donald St, Fox St across SH2 and then turn into Birdwood St and then Bell St, rather than turning off Fox St into Hickson St.

Either way, it will increase traffic going past St Teresas School. At present this will be heaviest in the morning before school starts, and in the evenings well after school is over for the day, but if the frequency of rail services increases as planned, then this could create a problem in the future.

Question 18: Do you have any feedback on the suggested upgrades in 14.4?

a. Birdwood Street (both north and south of Fox Street) formed into shared spaces, with reduced width for vehicle movement; to slow vehicle speeds and to allow easier crossing between areas of open space. Improved linkages to Anzac Hall and Bell Street. Support this.

It just seems to be missing pedestrian / cycle crossings across Fox St to Clifford Square and to the Public toilets / Playground.

b. New raised table (sections of the carriageway raised to footpath level) at west end, adjacent to 'Squirkle', and outside of Library to slow vehicles entering the Town Heart area; to improve safety for pedestrians and cyclists.

Don't support this as it seems unnecessary.

What we got definitely didn't live up to this and had the added disadvantage of leaving a lot of patches of tar sparsely covered with stones. These patches are very susceptible to becoming soft when the weather is warm (doesn't even need to be hot) resulting in tar regularly getting tracked into our business by customers. At first I figured it would be a temporary issue, because the road had just been resealed but it persisted. I eventually called SWDC about it to ask what could be done and was told that they would pass it on to NZTA. This was a while ago now. Unfortunately, it continues to be a problem even a few years later. We can't keep up with cleaning the tar off our carpet. h. Work with Wellington Water and Waka Kotahi to resolve existing flooding issues SH2 in vicinity of Daniell Street A resolution to this is, as you know, long overdue! i. Investigate and promote installation of EV Chargers in Town Centre Heart Area This is a bit out of the blue as (as far as I noticed) it isn't mentioned anywhere else in the consultation document. Not a bad idea though. Especially if it is a different provider to the one in the supermarket carpark so as to give more options to people passing through.

I would encourage Council to advocate for Featherston with Kiwirail to ensure this crossing stays open to vehicles.

Access for vollies to get to the fire station quickly is needed. Closing the Fox St will make it difficult for those in the north-west of town. Also restricts the firetruck's movements when responding to calls. With the proposed changes to the main street, having Fox St as an alternative way for people to get on to SH2 north without going through the centre is desirable. I believe closing this crossing to cars would create more congestion at the SH2/Wakefield intersection.

If Kiwirail are not amenable and want to continue with closing the crossing, do NOT make Daniell St past the police station one way. I believe there is enough room to make the pocket park next to the railway line a shared feature space without needing to narrow Daniell St.
