New Annual Plan now available

Thank you to all those who provided feedback on the Annual Plan. After much consideration, the Council approved the new initiatives listed below. The resulting rates increase of 5.48% is slightly higher than the 4.76% forecast in the Long Term Plan, and the 4.69% forecast in the Annual Plan Consultation Document.

New initiates in the Plan include:

- a 12-month trial in the reduction in library charges (option 2 as set out in the consultation document; the same option was chosen by Carterton District Council)
- a trial of extended swimming pool hours for one season, at the end of which we will examine swimmer numbers during the extended hours
- a change in funding of our housing for seniors, which includes a rental increase for tenants
- extra footpath maintenance funded by infrastructure reserves
- increased funding to build a new dog pound.

Chlorination of the Martinborough water supply

Urgent action is required to ensure that the town's water is clean, clear, safe and secure for the long-term. On Wednesday 26 June, Council agreed to consult with the community on the risks associated with the existing arrangements for the town's temporary water chlorination, and the timing and construction of the manganese removal plant.

The manganese naturally occurring in the town's water supply can block filters and when mixed with chlorine can cause discolouration. The town is currently being supplied with water from one bore with low enough manganese levels to allow chlorination. However, operating from one bore is not sustainable so we need to act now.

Council will soon be actively seeking an exchange of information, points of view and options regarding the continuance of chlorination. At the same time, Council will proceed towards building the manganese extraction plant to allow permanent chlorination.

The build will be primarily loan funded with the remainder coming from the Martinborough infrastructure reserve. This means that the cost of the manganese plant will be achieved within the Annual Plan budget.

Recycling wheelie bins are coming

Wheelie bins for recycling are coming soon to urban households who receive the Council recycling collection service. The wheelie bins are being delivered over the coming weeks, with the service expected to start in September. As well as giving extra recycling capacity, they will have lids with clips to keep recyclables from blowing away. Smart tags on the bins will also help identify bins that go missing.

The current recycling crates are not going away, but instead will be used for glass only. Wheelie bins and crates for glass will be picked up on alternate weeks. When you receive your wheelie bin, you'll get a handbook to answer any questions. In the meantime, you'll find frequently asked questions on our website.


Large item kerbside collection

This 'inorganic' refuse collection takes place twice a year on your usual collection day in the week commencing 29 July 2019. The collection schedule is as follows:

- Monday 29 July Martinborough rural and coastal
- Tuesday 30 July Greytown
- Wednesday 31 July Martinborough
- Thursday 1 August Featherston.

The collection is limited to one item per property:

- up to 15 kg in weight, and
- must be able to be lifted by one person.

Sport NZ Rural Travel Fund 2019/20

Funding Round Open 1 July 2019 - 23 August 2019

Applications are now being accepted from school and sports club teams located in the South Wairarapa district.

SWDC has \$9,500, provided by Sport NZ, to give to local school or sports club teams in the South Wairarapa who have young people aged between 5-19 years that require subsidies to assist with transport expenses to local sporting competitions.

Rebates 2019/20

The Rates Rebate Scheme provides a rebate of up to \$640.00 for low income earners. Rate payers must have been living in the home they own on 1 July 2019.

- 1. Your rebate will be calculated based on your gross income from 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019, your rates, and the number of dependants you have. The income eligibility for a rebate is \$25,560-\$42,000.
- You must provide proof of income from your income provider for ALL forms of income, including interest & dividends. Application forms will be sent to those who have received a rebate in 2018/2019 and are also available from the Featherston and Greytown Libraries, the Council office and online swdc.govt.nz/rates-and-property.

We now have a facility to send rates invoices by email. If you wish to receive your rate notice by email contact rates@swdc.govt.nz

We encourage you to take up this option to allow Council to use the postage savings on projects to benefit the district.

The last day for payment is 20th August 2019. Please pay by this date to avoid the 10% penalty.

Please help us to process payments by ensuring you include the property valuation number for all properties you are paying. If paying online please make a separate payment for each property.

Having trouble paying your rates?

Please contact us as soon as possible so we can work with you on a payment plan. Council's policy is to approach banks and legal representatives to assist us in recovering arrears at the end of the rating year.

Payment by Direct Debit

Council encourages ratepayers to pay rates via Direct Debit as this ensures the correct amount is paid and you avoid paying penalties for late payment.

Based on feedback from ratepayers, we now offer **weekly**, **fortnightly, monthly or quarterly direct debit options** to pay rates.

Direct debit is the easiest way to pay your rates as we withdraw the funds directly from your bank account at the very last minute. That way you will get the benefit of your funds for the longest possible time, and avoid penalties. If you would like your payments to be made by using this method the forms are available from the Featherston and Greytown Libraries as well as the Council office and on our website **swdc.govt.nz/rates-and-property**. All you need to do is complete the form and send it to SWDC, PO Box 6, Martinborough 5741, scan and email it to **rates@swdc.govt.nz** or drop it off at either the Council office in Martinborough or at the Featherston or Greytown Libraries.
