**DECISION ON THE PAPERS**

This is an application by **Tonic Bistro Partnership** for a Temporary Authority in respect of premises situated at 8 Kitchener Street, Martinborough and known as "**Tonic Bistro**".

The Police and the Inspector have no opposition to this application. Accordingly, we deal with the matter on the papers.

We are satisfied as to the matters to which we must have regard, as set out in s.3, s.4 and s.136 of the Act. We grant **Tonic Bistro** the Temporary Authority for three months period from the date of issue.

**REASON FOR DECISION**

This application has been considered on the basis of the reports received from the Alcohol Licensing Inspector and the Police. No matters have been raised with the Committee by the reporting agencies that would suggest that this Temporary Licence should not be granted.

The applicant has established that they hold a right, title or estate in the premises, being a requirement under the Act to obtain a Temporary Authority.

The District Licensing Committee Chair, acting pursuant to s136 of the Act, is satisfied all criteria has been met. I therefore grant **Tonic Bistro** the Temporary Licence, subject to the conditions of licence 44/ON/001/2001 which apply to this Temporary Licence, as outlined in (a) to (j) below.

**CONDITIONS**

The conditions relating to licence apply to this Temporary Authority, as outlined in (a) to (f) below:

- (a) No alcohol is to be sold, supplied, or consumed on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1:00 pm on Anzac Day to any person unless:
- They are people who are lodging or residing on the premises, or
  - They are people who are present on the premises to dine.
- (b) Alcohol may only be available for sale, supply or consumption on the following days and during the following hours: **Monday to Sunday between 8:00am and 12:00am midnight.**

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- (c) Drinking water is to be provided to patrons free of charge from a water supply prominently situated on the premises at all times that alcohol is available for sale, supply and consumption.
- (d) Food must be available for consumption on the premises at all times the premises are open for the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol, in accordance with the menu supplied with the application for this licence or menu variations of a similar range and standard. Menus must be visible, and food should be actively promoted.
- (e) The following steps must be taken to promote the responsible consumption of alcohol:
- Implement and maintain the Host Responsibility Policy submitted with the application for the licence.
  - At all times when the premises are open for the sale, supply or consumption of alcohol, a reasonable range of non-alcoholic refreshments and low-alcohol options are available.
  - The Licensee must ensure that signs are prominently displayed within the licensed premises detailing the availability of assistance and information regarding alternative forms of transport from the premises.
  - The licensee must implement and maintain steps proposed in the application for the licence aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- (f) The following steps must be taken to ensure that the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed:
- A restriction of sale or supply of alcohol to persons under the age of 18 years of age.
  - Display of appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.
- (g) The premises are undesignated.
- (h) The licensee must ensure that at all times a copy of the licence, together with a statement of all conditions subject to which it is issued, is displayed at the principal entrance so as to be easily read by people using the premises.
- (i) The holder of a manager's certificate or a properly notified manager shall be on duty and on the premises at all times alcohol is available for sale, supply and consumption.
- (j) A telephone must be freely available for customers to call for transport & staff must assist if required. Telephone numbers for alternative forms of transport from the premises must be displayed.
